YANKEES WIN AVIATION HONORS

Ending of Great Meet Shows
Americans Win Clear
Victory

Aviation Field, Los Angeles, Jan. 22.—As dusk gathered over the old Dominguez ranch last night four flying machines that had been circling in the air in rivalry of the meadow-larks that for so many centuries have held dominion there, settled softly to earth. The masters of the newest air craft walked to their tents, the great crowd filed down the roadway, and the first international aviation meet ever held in America was over.

All was peaceful and but few knew that one man had been near death in those last few minutes. Charles K. Hamilton was returning from a 15-mile flight toward the ocean, and while a mile from the aviation field the crank shaft of his machine snapped. To ship it would have meant a helpless drift upon the sea. To the aeroplane it means so little that no one in the crowd noticed anything wrong. Hamilton shut off his engine and so leveled and away his planes that he was wafted gently down, touching with scarcely a thud. It was the best piece of emergency handling of a machine that has been seen at the meet.

Curtiss Outspeeds Paulhan. Curtiss and Paulhan—the great rivals of the meet—furnished the excitement for the closing day. Paulhan went up at 3:25 o'clock for an endurance flight. After he had gone two or three laps of the course, Curtiss started on a ten-lap speed trial, half a lap, or more than three-fourths of a mile behind Paulhan. Instantly it was seen that a great race was on—the first real race of the ten days.

The two airships, full power on, came over the grandstand with the speed of express trains. Curtiss, it was plain, was gaining. He swept swiftly on Paulhan's heels, and on the third lap after starting he reached Paulhan, flying above. The Frenchman for a few seconds held his own, then Curtiss, in his American machine, forged ahead by a nose, a length and finally by half a lap. It was no race after that. The American machine was demonstrated as the faster beyond question.

As Curtiss rushed over Paulhan he received the greatest applause that any of his efforts have evoked. Paulhan went on until he had traveled 64.4 miles and had been in the air nearly an hour and a half. Curtiss came down after a 30-mile trip.

Standing of Rivals. This race gives the whole story of the meet. The Curtiss machine has won all the prizes for speed, quick starts, perfect landings, and those events where a light, swift machine showed best.

Paulhan has won all the cross-country, passenger-carrying and endurance tests, having a heavier, slower machine and an engine which he trusts completely. Paulhan has taken more than \$15,000 in prizes, and has broken the world's records for altitudes and for cross country flights alone and with a passenger.

UNIONISTS GAINS
GROWING DAILY

London, Jan. 22.—Gains of the Unionists in the Parliamentary elections today continued with accelerated pace, their total net gain being 59 seats. Thirteen of the Unionist gains were in county seats, one in Scotland and one in Wales. If the Unionists gain 22 of the 168 remaining seats, the government will be dependent upon the votes of the votes of the Nationalists to legislate.

The old-fashioned English country people, with their reverence for the nobility and their prejudices against now-fashioned Socialism, were heard from today and they gave a decided boost to the Conservative stock. Tonight the Unionists everywhere have taken cheer.

STETSON REGIME
IS WIPED OUT

New York, Jan. 22.—The last vestige of the Stetson machine, which has controlled the First Church of Christ, Scientist, of this city, since its founding, passed away today, when the candidates endorsed by Mrs. Augusta Stetson for re-election to the board of directors of the church were beaten by a vote of 732 to 486.

The announcement of the vote came at 4 o'clock this morning, following a session which lasted from 8 o'clock last night to 3 o'clock this morning, when the balloting ceased. The mother church at Boston today is in absolute control. Whether it will remain so is believed to hinge upon the decision of the Stetsonites to take the election matter to the courts. If this is done it will be on allegations that certain members not entitled to vote were allowed to cast ballots.

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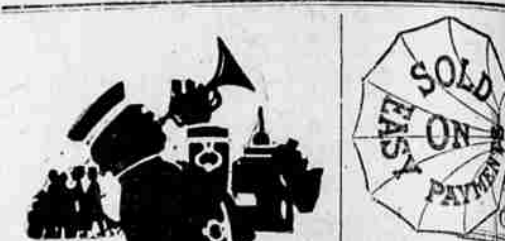
