EUGENE PEOPLE

Man with Meteoric Career Suddenly Departs for Other Climes.

J. E. Edgeworth, who recently came here from Ottawa, Kan., and who, in partnership with C. J. Murphy, opened a small electrical supply store under the name of the Oregon Electric Engineering Company, at 640 Williamette street is reported missing by numerous of the firm's creditors. It has been discovered that Edgeworth had sent his family from this city last Friday, and has since followed them, leaving behind the record of a somewhat meteoric career.

Shortly after the store was opened, Edgeworth ousted Murphy from the business. Later Murphy and Harry Briggs purchased Edgeworth out, receiving from him a bill of sale, and many invoices from the M. J. Walsh Company, of Portland, all stamped "paid," and representing goods valued at \$480. Immediately after the sale Edgeworth wrote the Portland firm, telling them that he had sold out, but asking them not to send a bill for the goods to his successors, as he would shortly call on them and pay in person. He added that Eugene had made him a bankrupt.

A member of the Walsh Company came to this city on receipt of the letter, and took possession of the stock in trade at the Murphy-Briggs store. Murphy and Briggs, and the various creditors of the firm, had discovered \$400 of the firm's money in the meantime and refused to give this up. Creditors of Edgeworth, who figure in all trades in the city, have since learned that the Kansas man operated a similar scheme in Ottawa, Kan., some time ago, and also in a California town. During his stay here Edgeworth regularly attended a local church and took a deep interest in church work it is said.

QUICKSILVER MIN E

IS ABANDONED

W. B. Dennis Finally Quits After a Decade of Work

The quicksilver mines at Black Butte, eighteen miles from Cottage Grove, have practically been abandoned, and it is quite improbable the company which has been operating there for a decade or more will further prosecute the work, says the Sentinel. W. B. Dennis, who has been at the head of the company as manager and superintendent, has gone to Portland to reside, and there is now engaged in the lumber business. William Harris is still at Black Butte looking after the property interests of the company. It is said that little quicksilver was produced at the mine under the new system installed by Dennis, although it had been demonstrated beyond question that quicksilver is there in paying quantities. Dennis' experimental work on a new furnace proved, to his own satisfaction at least, that he had discovered a more economical way of producing the metal mercury, and he razed the old furnace and constructed one according to his liking, but after expending a considerable amount of money in testing the system it and the mine have been abandoned.

WILL SCOTT START

ANOTHER PAPER?

Portland Paper Says All Arrangements are Completed for the Launching

The Sketch, Portland, says: Harvey Scott is to withdraw his interest from the Oregonian and will launch a new morning paper in Portland on or about April 1st. He and his associates have leased the basement and three upper floors of the building at the corner of Alder and Fourth streets, now used by the Belvidere hotel. They have invested \$125,000 in printing machinery, which will soon be shipped from the east. Edgar B. Piper, present managing editor of the Oregonian; Leslie Scott, the great editor's son; O. C. Leiter, city editor of the Oregonian, and a number of others are interested in the new venture, and will be associated in the management of the paper. The new paper will be Republican in politics, and will support the regular organization. It will have the Associated Press report, as Mr. Scott owns the exclusive franchise for Portland. This asset is valued at a considerable fortune, and its loss would prove a severe blow to the Oregonian. The foregoing is the apparently well authenticated story which leaked out today, and the Sketch is the first to give it to the public.
