SPRINGFIELD

STINSON HAS NOT LEFT SPRINGFIELD

The Springfield News had a story in last week's issue stating that "D. E. Stinson, who has had a plumbing shop in this city for the past year, 'came up missing Wednesday morning and has not been seen or heard of since,' that he had moved out his household goods in the night, and that his employees, the News and others had been stung because 'Stinson had hid to greener fields and pastures now.'"

D. E. Stinson is still in Springfield and says he intends to remain here, at least until his bills are squared. The News story is but a street rumor that was circulated as the result of a peculiar incident. It seems that Mr. Stinson had employed a couple of men to do the plumbing work while he has been in the employ of the railroad. Last week he resigned this position and went to Portland to see about business matters. He did not know that his former partner had bought some tools on a contract to pay for them at a certain time or give them up. While in Portland the time ran out and when he returned Friday he found that part of his business had been sold and that he had been branded in the local newspaper as an absconding debtor. One object of his Portland trip was to secure money to settle his accounts and the story that he removed his household goods in the night and left secretly is purely a fabrication. The plumbing business will hereafter be conducted by Beamer & Smithson, who are both well known here and are experienced plumbers.

tinued to the house with typhoid fever. Ben McPherson has said his five-acre ranch east of town, north on East Main street, to J. R. Holbrook, who now resides at Lakewill. Mr. Holbrook will soon move to Springfield to reside permanently.—News.
