INSPECTION OF
NATIONAL GUARD
FEBRUARY 22-23General Orders Received by Eu-
gene Officers from Adju-
tant General Finzer

Local National Guard officers
have received orders from Adjutant-
General W. E. Finzer for the annual
inspection. Co. C will be inspected on
Tuesday evening, Feb. 22, and
Co. A on the following evening.
Captain Campbell King, of the First
Infantry, regular army, has been as-
signed to inspect the local companies
and other companies of the Fourth
regiment.

The orders from General Finzer
are as follows:

The several subdivisions of the
Oregon National Guard will assemble
under arms, field uniform, heavy
marching order at their respective
armories at 8:30 o'clock p. m. on
the following dates: (Here the
dates of inspection of the different
companies in both regiments are
given.)

All corps, field and staff officers
residing at cities occupied by troops,
will report to the inspecting officer
at the date and hour named above.
All public property will be suit-
ably arranged for rapid inspection.
Company books and records must be
present.

MOUTH OF SIUSLAW

W. G. Carroll, an assistant engi-
neer in the corps of engineers, United
States army, has obtained a leave of

steamer Breakwater, when she made

work of building the new jetty at
Siustaw. Mr. Carroll was appointed
Chief Engineer by the Port of Siustaw

be done under government super-
vision.

amount of \$100,000.
