SPRINGFIELD AND VICINITY

NEW SCHOOL AT

SEVENTH AND G

Springfield's new \$20,000 school house will be located at Seventh and G streets, according to a vote taken Friday at the school meeting called to rescind the action taken two weeks ago in selecting the site. There were two locations proposed, one on the Brattain place on Tenth and C streets, the other a block and a quarter owned by Mrs. Richardson and Jim Clark on Seventh and G.

There was a big difference of opinion on the choice and the whole evening was spent discussing the comparative merits of the two. The vote when taken showed only a difference of 7, being 98 to 91. There was a very large crowd out and unusual interest was taken.

The price to be paid for the property, which is two acres, is \$3600. The land covers about a block and a quarter. There are two houses on the site now, which can probably be moved off and sold for some five or six hundred dollars. This will leave probably \$17,000 bonds to carry, as they should, at the election to build on April 2.

The rivalry of different locations in the various portions of the city has been over the selection of this site as evidenced by the second meeting to decide the matter.

There is a little talk on the part of a few that, now being disappointed in the location, they would oppose the bond issue next week. Although this has only been expressed by a few, it does not show a very good spirit for a growing city and should be dropped quickly.

The uncertainty of the city limits on the east side, due to the suit now in court, probably influenced the vote to go as it did.

TWO MORE CASES

OF DIPHTHERIA

Two more cases of diphtheria have developed in West Springfield, but they are both in the family of Mr. Ralston, who is just recovering from the disease. The Ralston 3-year-old child is ill with one of the worst forms of the disease and may not live. The other case is Miss Jackson, sister-in-law of Mr. Ralston, who is living with them; hers is not serious. The whole family have been subjected to antitoxin and it is not expected to spread further. The child's condition is very grave. For the past two nights she has not been expected to live, but she is resting somewhat better today. The severe form of the disease and the age of the child are very unfavorable. The disease is in the hands of Barr and Pollard.

CUTTING TIMBER

FOR OIL WELLS

The saw mill is cutting a shipment of heavy timbers for the oil wells in California, known as "walking beams." They are used on the big pumps, and ride on a pivot in the center, with platons of the pumps and engines fastened at the ends. They are beveled from the center and require the best of timber for which reason they are cut here.

The "head blocks" for the new carriage to be installed in the mill have been held up in the mountains some where, enroute from the east ever since the snow trouble several weeks ago, and tracers have been sent after them to no avail. The big carriage will be installed in the mill as soon as they arrive. With them is an additional planer for the planing mill.

PUMPING STATION

TO BE ENLARGED

A new pump has been delivered to the Northwestern Corporation's water plant in Springfield, and it, with the one now in use will be installed in a special pumping plant, to be located outside the building in a pit near where the seven wells are located. This was planned some time ago, but the shipment of the additional pump has been delayed. A pit will be dug just east of the plant, and lined with concrete. The company will be prepared to deliver all the water the city can use for some time, and it will all be taken out of wells. This will allow irrigation in the summer time.
