U.O. BASEBALL TEAM TO TAKE EXTENDED TRIP

Will Make Tour of Washington and Idaho, Playing 12 Games

The University of Oregon baseball team starts next week on the longest trip ever taken by the team through Washington and Idaho, and plays some twelve games in ten days. Just twelve men will go on the trip, and the competition for places this week is keen. The squad leaves Eugene next Tuesday night for Seattle, where they play the University of Washington on Wednesday and Thursday; at Spokane they meet the Northwest League team on Friday, and on Saturday there is a game with either the Coeur d'Alene or Lewiston, Ida., team. The team stays over Sunday at Pullman, Washington, where they play Washington State College on Monday. On Wednesday and Thursday they cross bats with Idaho at Moscow, and on Friday and Saturday they complete the trip with two games against Whitman at Walla Walla. This leaves them Sunday to get back to college to start school again the next day without any spring vacation.

The twelve games will be hard on the players, but the hardest games are first. The game they fear the most is the one with Washington. The Seattle team is said to be stronger this year than ever before, with all their old men back. It will be after two hard games in Eugene Monday and Tuesday, with a hard night's trip north. The Northwest League team at Seattle the boys hardly expect to beat, but Saturday's game will be practice. Sunday's rest will help them in shape for Pullman, and judging from reports from there they should leave their impression behind and carry away a better percentage. Idaho's standing may be known by a game which they play with Whitman this week, and the two games here on the 11th and 12th.

Everything considered, the Oregon team is in pretty good condition and there is good reason to expect it to come back at the head of the league, and to fact end the season that way. The only place that seems to be hard to fill is that of a right hand pitcher. Henkle is perhaps the best man in the box that Oregon ever had but he cannot throw all the time and there must be a man to fall back on in case anything should happen to him. There are three men who follow him but are not yet in his class. They are in the order of the value, Word, Rinehart and VanMater. The work of the first two is about equal, but the need is for right-handed men and Rinehart is left. VanMater is right. However, Coach Kelly hopes to bring these men up on the trip and will use all three. At Seattle, unless it becomes necessary, Henkle will not touch the ball in order that he may last out well to the end of the trip.

The infield has had to be changed this week because McKenzie, on third base, has had to leave college owing to the death of his father. In his place Doble will be shifted from second and over the second bag will be tried McIntosh or perhaps Mound. Cohen is strong on playing and has fielded is slowly all around, while the outfield could not be much stronger.

If Oregon can win next Monday and Tuesday she will leave home with a 1000 per cent standing and there are great hopes that she can keep up the pace. Kelly is optimistic over the trip and modestly says that he expects to come back at least ahead.

"CHUCK" TAYLOR QUILTS TRACK FOR BASEBALL

The University of Oregon track team has lost its best all around athlete in "Chuck" Taylor, who has gone over to baseball where he has a place on the team as extra catcher. The track men are feeling pretty blue over the situation for this season's athletic showing and fear that the record of Oregon is not losing a meet in seven years, will be broken. Already short of material and some of her best men out from injuries and an apparent feeling of indifference on the part of the students, the loss of Taylor comes almost as a last straw, and unless things change very soon there will be no laurels of victory for Oregon on the athletic field. The lack of interest in Friday night's indoor meet, which is usually attended by a packed house, as shown by a few scattered admirers in the gallery, was very discouraging.

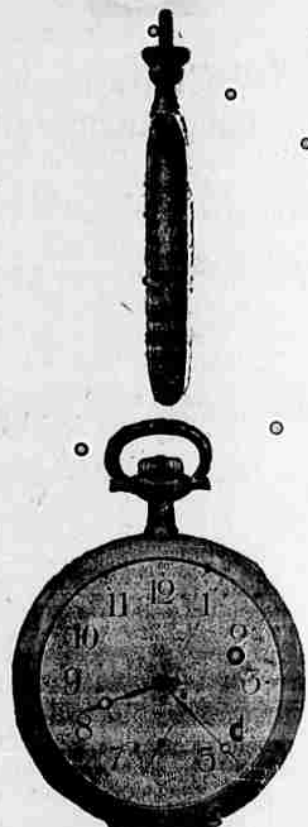
