TEXT OF SENATE AMENDMENT OF SIUSLAW BILL

As Introduced By Senator Bourne and Approved by Commerce Committee

The following is the full text of the Siuslaw River amendment introduced in the senate by Senator Bourne and approved by the Senate Commerce Committee: "Improving Siuslaw river, Oregon, at the mouth, in accordance with the project set forth in the report submitted in House Document, Numbered six hundred and forty-eight; Sixty-first Congress, second session, Fifty thousand Dollars: Provided, That the Secretary of War may enter into a contract or contracts for such material and work as may be necessary to complete said project and to maintain the same for one year during construction, to be paid for as appropriations may from time to time be made by law, not to exceed in the aggregate Three Hundred and Eighty One Thousand Dollars, exclusive of the amount herein appropriated: Provided, further, That before beginning said work or making said contract or contracts, the Secretary of War shall be satisfied by deposit or otherwise that the Port of Siuslaw or other agency shall provide for the accomplishment of said project, the sum of Two Hundred and Fifteen Thousand Dollars to be expended by him in the prosecution of said work: Provided, further also, That from the amount he provided by the Port of Siuslaw or other agency may be reduced by such amount as said Port may have expended in such construction of the south jetty as can be utilized by the engineer officer in charge of the work in the execution of the plans adopted."

PRESIDENT MOORE, OF OREGON TRUST, WILL PLEAD GUILTY

Portland, Or., April 13.—W. H. Moore, ex-president of the Oregon Trust & Savings Bank, will plead guilty today to one of the five indictments with which he is charged. Mr. Moore will appear before Presiding Judge Morrow this morning and will plead guilty to a charge of having accepted deposits when the bank was insolvent. This plea is the result, it is believed, of an informal agreement entered into by District Attorney Cameron, on behalf of the state and Charles W. Fulton, representing Moore. Mr. Fulton communicated with Mr. Cameron yesterday and informed him his client would make the plea of guilty. That by this means the united evidence of Moore and E. E. Lytle may be obtained against W. Cooper Morris seems assured. By Moore making a plea of guilty, he may be used to give state's evidence. Such a plea will result in Moore escaping imprisonment, but it is believed he will receive the maximum fine, \$1000.
