Eugene will open the season at Cottage Grove, and from all reports these teams are fast rounding into shape for the struggle. The fans will see many new faces this year, of players that have been signed from other leagues, and all the teams seem to be well balanced in the pitching departments, so the struggle will undoubtedly be close when the season closes.
