SPRINGFIELD AND VICINITY

BASEBALL TEAM IS STRENGTHENED

Springfield, April 21.—Manager Elmer Cox, of the Springfield baseball team this morning signing up a new man to fill the place of Welch at second base, who will be unable to play with the team this summer because of conflicting engagements. The man is Ryan, who played second with Albina last year in the Tri-City League. Springfield is very ready to sign him, for he is an unusually good pick-up. He will be up here in a day or so, and work out with the boys a few times. Ryan is long on hard hitting, and knows the game well.

Manager Cox is very much pleased with the showing that his "army" made Sunday, and has great hopes for the valley pennant. He feels that Eugene's bunch is not as fast as many have expected, and that Albany will be the hardest competitor. Elmer admits modestly that the victory Sunday was only baseball luck, and that he has a fight on his hands every time he meets Albany. The game with Cottage Grove next Sunday does not seem to worry him any, but yet Springfield will be prepared for a stiff game, for judging from Sunday's game they have lots of fight and little quit in them.

Springfield really has a splendid chance this season to make the top of the league, for besides having almost the same team as last year, and Elmer Cox's judgment and luck in picking up men and winning the first game, there are other reasons for her success. Springfield is one of the

hardest teams in the valley. There is no better field in the state. In Schermer, in the box, is the team's most valuable man. He not only has a wide assortment of breaks and twists, but he knows every batter in the league and can deal out just the right ball to make the man play to his disadvantage. He knows all the men's style of hitting, because he has played with nearly all of them at one time or another on the same team.

Springfield plays Cottage Grove on Sunday, and by this will get a line on Eugene, with whom she tosses ball in two weeks. A game is played with the University of Oregon team two weeks from Saturday, May 7.

RAILROAD MAN INVESTING HERE

Springfield, April 21.—There is one outsider, a railroad man, who may have some knowledge as to the future of the city, who is investing more than just a little money in Springfield. This is J. N. Gortery, engineer of the Southern Pacific at Natron. The latest investment is in a plan where he and John Winzenried will erect on a block at 7th and C streets, which they now own, possibly four California bungalows, which will be modern in every respect. The first one will be erected at once. It will have a concrete foundation and the outside will be finished in rough boards, stained. The inside will be hard wood and plaster, handsomely stained. Each will contain five rooms, besides closets and porches.

R. R. COMMISSION REQUESTS S. P. CO. TO RESTORE RATE

Salem, Or., April 20.—The Southern Pacific company has been requested by the railroad commission, as a result of the agitation started by the open river convention at Albany, to restore its arbitrary rate on transcontinental freight shipments. If the railroad company refuses the matter will be taken up in a formal manner by the commission. The 10 per cent arbitrary rate between Portland and valley points was abolished March 22 and a differential rate substituted.

BIDS FOR COTTAGE GROVE'S PIPE LINE

Cottage Grove, Or., April 20.—The city has instructed Recorder Van Denburg to advertise for bids for the construction of a complete water system and pipeline from Laying Creek, about 20 miles distant from here, work to begin as soon as possible on the same.
