SUNDRY CIVIL BILL REPORTED BY COMMITTEE

Carries Over One Hundred and Eleven Million Dollars

Washington, May 6.—The sundry civil appropriation bill, the largest of all the appropriation bills, and carrying a total of \$111,849,111, was reported to the house today by the committee on appropriations. The total represents a cut of \$16,650,000 from the estimates submitted to the committee and is more than \$20,000,000 less than the sundry civil bill carried for the current fiscal year. The largest single item is \$37,859,890 for continuation of the construction of the Panama canal. This sum is reimbursable to the treasury from the sale of bonds.

CITY NEWS

Notice of appeal to the supreme court has been filed by the attorney for the plaintiff in the case of E. W. Miles vs. V. Hemenway, to recover money on a land sale. H. E. Slattery is attorney for the plaintiff and A. C. Woodcock for the defendant.

Police Officer Bonney is ordering a good many new sidewalks built, and he says the property owners are complying with the orders very readily. A good many are putting in cement walks even where they are not required. The officer says he is also after property owners about connecting toilets with sewers. He finds that a number who were ordered to make connection three and four years ago have not yet done so, and he is after them rough-shod for their non-compliance with order. There is a penalty attached to the failure to connect.

A good many people of Eugene have enquired lately as to the status of the suit of the Federal government against the Oregon & California railroad Co. on the land grant cases. Manager Freeman, of the Commercial club, has received a letter from Congressman Hawley that the government's brief in the case filed Washington on May 3 for Portland, and that he has "been urging expedition in this matter and hopes the case will be pushed as fast as is consonant with the case for the rights of the parties concerned."

Dr. F. W. Comings has in his office in the Eugene Loan & Savings bank building an heirloom that no values very highly. FOREIGN MINERS OF INDIANA ON RAMPAGE

Do Not Understand Terms of New Contract With Operators

Terre Haute, Ind., May 6.—A mob of five hundred foreign miners is marching on the mines of Clinton, according to reports from that field, and the leaders declare no work shall be done in the mines. The country authorities have hurried to the scene.

Foreign miners do not understand the terms of the new wage contract between the United Mine Workers and the mine operators under which work in the mines was resumed. They met the trains into Clinton and with revolvers forced the American miners to leave the cars before the trains proceeded to the mines.

STRUCK FROM RAILROAD BILL BY THE HOUSE

Washington, May 6.—The House struck out the entire section 12 of the railroad bill prohibiting the acquisition of stock by competing lines. The vote was 131 to 136. The motion was made by Adamson of Georgia, in charge of the democratic side. The house rejected the Sulzer amendment to the anti-merger section of the railroad bill striking out the words "common carriers" from the section. The purpose of the amendment, Sulzer explained, was to make it apply to such companies as the Northern Securities Company.
