CAMPUS IMPROVED BY UNIVERSITY STUDENTS

Instead of Annual Class Rush, Cement Walks Built and Improvements Made

Two hundred students of the University this morning donned their working clothes and made some substantial improvements on the campus. Nearly a hundred feet of cement walk was built at the Twelfth street entrance to Dandy hall, several hundred feet of board sidewalk was built on the athletic field, the big cement "O" on the butte was given a fresh coat of bright yellow paint, and many other minor improvements were made on the campus and athletic field. The masculine members of the student body, with the exception of the athletes, were divided into four groups, with their "bosses," and at 8 o'clock hurried to the campus, armed with shovels, or hammers and saws, and others with paint and brush. There was no reluctance about starting, and piles of lumber and gravel, barrels of cement and pounds of nails quickly disappeared. The campus fairly bustled with activity and the ring of the hammer and other tools.

But far more noticeable on the campus was the darning here and there of fair coats. The girls of the four classes were preparing with the utmost precision the tables for the students at noon hour. The tables were separate for each class, and each group tried to outdo the others to make theirs the most attractive.

This custom is the substitution made a few years ago for the annual class rush, which still holds a traditional place in many colleges. Instead of a littered and torn-up campus and possibly not more than a dozen broken bones and twice that many injured feelings, there is just as good a time and much more benefits as a result. At the time that the rush was given up there was much adverse opinion, and it is now looked back upon as one of the best advances made in the University.

Oklahoma Fanatic Thinks His Step-Daughter Good to Stop Divine Wrath

Alone, Okla., May 19.—Because Henry Hellman, leader of a band of fanatics, wanted to sacrifice his 16 year old step-daughter, Jane Warfield, to save the world from the comet, mob violence is feared here. Hellman was arrested and is under guard at the county jail.

Hellman is a leader of a band of 40 fanatics. They believed the coming of the comet signified the vengeance of the Lord against the world and that only a human sacrifice would prevent a great catastrophe. Hellman offered his stepdaughter as a sacrifice.

Plans for the "offering" were made and Hellman and his followers were preparing to take the girl's life when the officers were informed and interfered.

The people of Alone were aroused by the threatened atrocity, and a demonstration against Hellman, and his fanatics followed. Threats of lynching have been made.
