NINE NEW TRACK

RECORDS ARE SET

Northwest College Athletics Establish Marks That May Long Stand.

Some long standing records have gone down a notch on the cinder path in the Northwest this year, and the University of Oregon, as usual, has carried off its full share. A glance over the revised list shows a total of nine records out of 16 indisputably under Oregon's colors, while a tenth is tied for with two other colleges.

Three of Oregon's record have been made this year with a team composed for the most part of new men. Washington State college, which "Bill" Hayward's athletes met in Eugene Friday in the last track meet of the college season, holds second honors with two records and a tie. Washington "U" came third with two and Whitman has one. Idaho is tied for one, and O. A. C. has none to its credit.

Records That Are Lowered.
Among the records which have been lowered this season are the two-mile run, in which Stookey, of W. S. C., set a new mark of 10:10; the mile and half-mile, both by Cool, of W. S. C. in 4:31 1-5 and 1:59 4-5 respectively; the pole vault, raised by Williams, of Oregon, to 12 feet 2-10 inch; the 120-yard hurdles, made by Hawkins, of Oregon, in 15 2-5, and the mile relay, made by Oregon in 3:27 2-5.

The Northwest college records compare favorably with similar records in the big colleges of the East.

In fact, it would be hard for the best Eastern teams to beat the records in the shot-put, hammer-throw, pole vault, broad jump, hurdles and dashes. McKinney's record of 46 feet in the shot-put ties the American college record made by Beck, of Yale, in 1905. Edmunson, of Idaho, has run the half-mile in 1:56 4-5, but not in a college meet.

W. S. C. WINS FROM

O. A. C., 72 TO 45

Corvallis, Or., May 30.—The only track and field meet held on the home field this year was carried off Saturday by Washington State College, 72 to 45. The weather was ideal and the track fairly fast.

Thompson, of W. S. C., tied the Coast record for the 220 low hurdles in the fast time of 25.1.

Nelson, W. S. C.'s big sprinter, walked away with the 100-yard dash in ten seconds, and carried away the 220-yard dash in 22 4-5 seconds.

The only record broken was the college record in the running broad jump. Startzoff, of O. A. C., made 22.05 feet. The results were:
