FRANK GOTCH STILL

WRESTLING CHAMPION

Chicago, June 1.—Frank Gotch, of Humboldt, Iowa, successfully defended his title as wrestling champion of the world by easily defeating Stanislaus Zbyszko, the Polish champion, in straight falls at the Coliseum tonight.

Gotch outclassed his bulkier opponent in every department of game. After Gotch had won the fall in the phenomenal time of 6 seconds, it was only a question how long the Pole could hold against the brilliant and varied tuck of his rival.

Crowd Hardly Realized Trick.
The immense crowd had hardly realized that the great match was before Referee Dick Fleming snapp Gotch on the back and cleared him the winner of the first fall. The ho that sent the Pole down was a bear arm and half Nelson. The first fall came so quickly that there was little intermission before the men face each other for the second time.

Warned by his sudden downfall Zbyszko was more cautious and took Gotch 27 minutes and 36 seconds to win the match with a bar arm and wrist lock.

PORTLAND BOOSTER JOE

Portland, Or., June 1.—Tom Richardson, for the last six years public manager of the Portland Commercial Club and secretary of the Oregon Development League, yesterday announced his intention of retiring from the dual position, June 30, desire to give more time to his private enterprises, coupled with stronger desire to "rest up" are the reasons assigned by Mr. Richards for his action.

"Immediately upon retiring will go with my family to my ranch in the Tualatin Valley and remain one solid month, without leaving I am going to take the first rest my business career," he said.

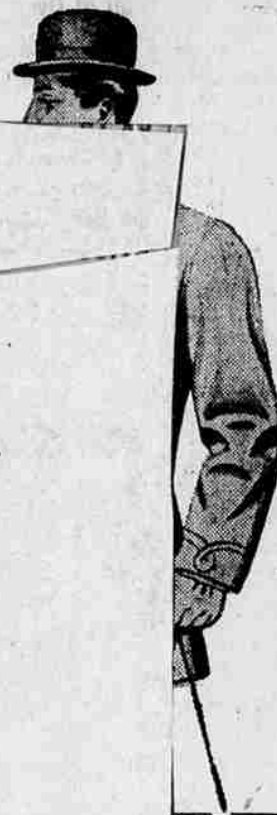
