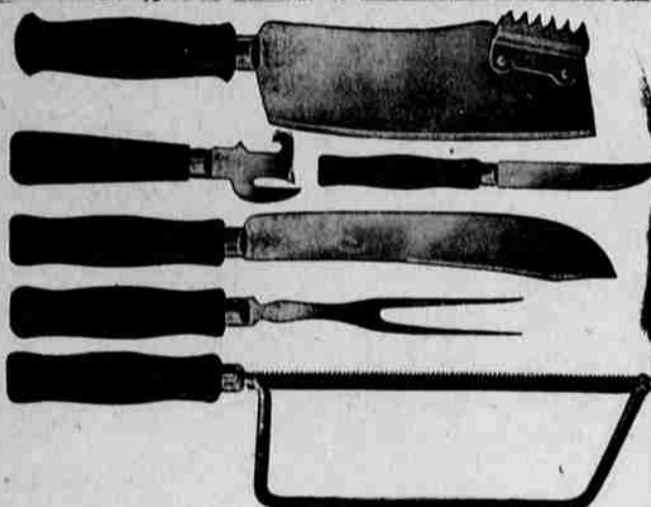

POSTMASTERS OF OREGON RECEIVE MORE PAY

Eugene Advanced From \$2700 to \$2800—Springfield Also Gets a Raise

Washington, June 7.—Because of the growth of the postal receipts during the past year the salaries of most of the presidential postmasters in Oregon and Washington will be increased July 1.
The Portland postmaster now receives the maximum salary and is not entitled to a further increase. CONVENTION OF EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN EUGENE NEXT WEEK

Following is a part of an editorial in the Oregon Churchman, the Episcopal church paper, on the coming convention in Eugene:
The twenty-second annual session of the convention of the diocese has been called to meet in Eugene on Thursday, June 16th. In another column will be found some particulars. We confidently look for the strongest and best convention in the history of the diocese. The tone of the annual sessions has been improving steadily of late years. There is a growing spirit of buoyancy and seriousness which is good to see, and along with it a growing tolerance and breadth which make for unity and efficiency. There are sure to be differences of opinions on many subjects. These differences will be frankly stated, and sometimes there may be vigorous debate, but we shall meet as brothers, and as brothers we will accept the results, whether we find ourselves, for the time and on the question up for decision, in the majority or the minority. Our work will be constructive, so far as we can make it so. The extension of the Kingdom will be the chief aim of all the members. We feel sure that all will try to make all the proceedings work to that end.
Action and Reaction.
The parish at Eugene is to be congratulated upon securing the convention. It will be worth far more than all the work and expense that the pastor and his people give to the care of it. The "action" of the convention, in whatever direction, will have a local reaction. The impetus imparted to the work of the church in Eugene ought to be very marked, and we believe it will be. A strong convention, working with hope and serious purpose, considering living problems, showing the work of the Kingdom to be the most important work in the world, cannot but have its effect. This effect should be all the more marked in view of the late unhappy controversies in the university town. A Christian church at once Catholic and open-minded, a form of Christian belief and practice free from fanaticism and vulgarity, and at the same time loyal to the Bible and to Apostolic tradition, cannot fail to come as a revelation to many townspeople, professors and students. Indeed, a good many of our own people are likely to catch a new vision if the convention arises to the possibilities of the occasion. And on the other hand, the stimulus of fresh scenes, the sensation of being guests of new people, the opportunity to view the work from a new vantage ground, will certainly have their effect on the convention. And so we congratulate the convention as well.

The Sort of Men.

The importance of sending strong men to Eugene will be evident. The clerical staff of the diocese is undoubtedly stronger, both in numbers and ability, than it has been for some time past. We trust that the vestries will elect lay delegates of commensurate strength. This is no work for weaklings. No man should be sent simply because he can go. It is very important that the delegates should go. But it is far more important that they should be men of proved character and ability. Doubtless there will be cases where the strongest men of the parish can go only at serious sacrifice. They are the men most needed. Their fellows should insist, so far as they properly can, that they make the necessary sacrifice. The work will be worth while. The man who stays away from Eugene will miss a great deal. There will be pleasure, inspiration, opportunity for service, in plenty. Let the strong men get into action.
