O. N. G. MONEYFOR NEW TARGET RANGE

For That Reason State Will Not

Send Team to Camp

Perry

Confirming The Guard's statement yesterday that the state of Oregon would not send a rifle team to the national shoot this year, Major C. C. Hammond, president of the Oregon State Rifle Association, today in an interview said:

"At a recent meeting of the association it was deemed inadvisable to send a state rifle team to Camp Perry, Ohio, to participate in the national matches this year, on account of lack of money."

"Adjutant General Finzer and the general staff are very anxious to send a team, but owing to the fact that the state has recently purchased an excellent rifle range and camp site, and the cost of it, together with the other expenses of maintaining the Guard, will not leave sufficient money available for sending a team east this year."

"It is to be regretted that Oregon cannot send a team. The fact of losing one year out of the rifle competition will be a distinct loss, and it will be hard to get back into the 'first class where the team stood last year. The Guardsmen devote so much of their time at their own expense, and the state and nation should show a greater appreciation."

O. N. G. Well Equipped

The National Guard of Oregon is larger, better equipped and more efficient now than ever before, but its armory rentals and other necessary military expenses have increased materially and the state appropriation remains the same. The O. N. G. deserves better treatment—more money.

President Roosevelt said that "good shooting is eighty per cent. of a soldier's efficiency." The versatile rough rider has had enough experience to know. It is the army with crack shots that wins nowadays.

Modern warfare is more a matter of expert shooting than anything else. To remain a first-class power, we must have military training. The National Guard stands for the highest type of loyal citizenship. The young man in that organization is serving a double duty. He is contributing his might and energy and intelligence as a good citizen and in addition is preparing himself with a military knowledge that is necessary to the defense of the nation. If America had never had a soldier, there would be no U. S. A., and we would be like China with the flags of all nations flying over her best cities and territories.

Should Not Forget

We should not forget the glorious achievements of our own Second Oregon and other volunteers in the late Spanish-American war. The soldier was a hero then in our hour of national peril. Should we forget him now? This country's greatest security lies in the military education and preparedness of the National Guard. The military is our national police force and is just as necessary as firemen or policemen for the nation's protection. We have had wars since the commencement of history—war has saved and made the world what it is. War is more likely now than ever before through the commercial greed of the nations, and a great war seems destined for the Pacific, perhaps at our very doors. The yellow peril is not an idle dream.

J. BOWERMAN IS
ACTING GOVERNOR

Benson Asks Him to Take Reins
of State—Quorums on
Board Needed

Salem, Or., June 15.—Jay Bowerman, president of the state Senate, will tomorrow assume the duties of the Governorship and will continue to discharge these duties until Governor Benson returns from San Francisco, where he is undergoing medical treatment.

A telegram authorizing President Bowerman to serve as Acting Governor was sent tonight by Governor Benson to C. N. McArthur, private secretary.

The principal reason for President Bowerman's needed presence at the capitol lies in the fact that business of the State Land Board will soon require the presence of a quorum of members, and as Governor-Secretary of State Benson is out of the state, the only remaining member is State Treasurer Steele, who, of course, cannot act alone.

Since Governor Benson's departure some weeks ago the routine of work of the office has been done by Private Secretary McArthur, but there are pending a number of matters upon which Mr. McArthur could not act without exceeding his authority. Full authority is, however, vested in President Bowerman by section 8 of article 5 of the constitution.

Lawyers agree that the authority of the Governor ceases when his absence from the state is protracted, and there is no reason to believe that Governor Benson's request that President Bowerman assume the duties of
