**D. E. YORAN WILL BE CHOSEN HEAD OF K. OF P.**

Eugene Man Has Clear Field for Highest Office of Order in Oregon

Portland, Or., June 21.—Darwin E. Yoran, of Eugene, has a clear field for the highest office within the gift of the grand body of Knights of Pythias, now in session here, and will be elected grand chancellor by acclamation.

For the office of grand vice-chancellor, there were a number of candidates announced last night, and it is believed that a number of ballots will be required to make a selection. Salem Pythians are urging the selection of Frank T. Wrightman, now serving in an appointive capacity as grand tribune.

Rainier Knights are here to land something for their lodge, and if they fail to elect A. L. Clark as grand vice-chancellor, will present the name of J. B. E. Bourne for grand master at arms.

Friends of City Attorney Grant developed a large amount of strength among the delegates last night for Grant for grand vice-chancellor. Mr. Grant himself is not an active aspirant, but his friends insist he should run. For prelate of the grand lodge, it is believed that the contest has narrowed down to Thomas Laughary, of Astoria, and W. W. Eifert, of Medford.

Reports from the grand chancellor will show that Oregon now has about 6400 Knights of Pythias in good standing, and that they have a record of expending \$15,654.70 for charitable work during the past year. Were it possible to list all private donations made on account of the order, that sum would probably be doubled.

**KENTUCKY MINISTERS FIGHT IN PULPIT; ONE STABBED IN EAR; DIES**

Rock Creek, Ky., June 18.—Rev. Robert Vanover is dead and Rev. Isaac Perry is under arrest following a duel fought with knives late last night. The duel took place in the pulpit of the Rock Creek Baptist church, where the participants were associate pastors. It is believed trouble over church affairs caused the fight. Rev. Vanover was stabbed in the left ear and the wound resulted in instant death.

**FINE NEW STREET CARS ARE COMING**  
Two That Are Much Larger Than Any Now In Use Ordered

Eugene is to have two new inter-urban street cars that are bigger than any in use here at present. They are 41 feet long, which is ten feet longer than the present cars in Eugene. The other will be unloaded at once, but one of the big cars that are now here will be sent to Salem for the P. E. & E.'s new system there. The two new cars are already on the way here, and are expected any day. They are of the most modern pattern, having the seats as in railroad passenger coaches. They will be used on the Springfield line exclusively. There are also coming additional freight cars and an electric motor that can be used to haul the trailer when needed. Eugene's street car service is to be second to none in the state and there will probably be arranged a closer schedule as soon as the loop around College Hill is finished and the Springfield bridge completed.

**HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL'S ENGAGEMENT ANNOUNCED**  
Professor Hug and Miss Mackenzie Will Wed on July 5

An interesting engagement has just been announced by the Misses Anne and May Shogren. It is that of their niece, Miss Gladys Mackenzie, to George W.
