ROUNDS AND GEARY WIN ORATORICAL PRIZES

All Orations of High Merit and
It Was Hard to Decide
the Winners

Before 1500 people who crowded Villard hall at the University last night to hear the Beekman-Failing oratorical contest, five of the best orations that have ever been delivered in this building were heard. There was so little difference between the excellence of the five, two of which were by girls, that it took the judges over fifteen minutes to pronounce their decision on the best two. The judges were Rev. Henry S. Templeton, '96; Arthur Veazie, '09, and Harvey Densmore, '03. It was as President Campbell said before he announced the winners, that in the minds of their friends every contestant had won first place. There was scarcely a fault in the delivery of any and the material was that which would come from statesmen.

The Failing prize for first place is the income not to exceed \$150 of a gift of \$2500 made by the late Henry Failing, of Portland, and the Beekman award is \$100 that is the interest on the donation of C. C. Beekman of \$1600. The judges are chosen by the faculty as three distinguished persons and are expected to consider the orations under the four heads of originality, style, excellence and delivery. The orations must be given without the aid of any manuscript.

"The Higher Law"
The oration of Harold Rounds, who was awarded first place, was as follows:

The basic principle upon which our legal system is founded is justice; justice pure and simple; justice untempered by sentiment; absolute justice. It is true that in the name of law justice is often misdirected and its course blocked; but as the theoretical if not the actual basis of law, this principle is the shrine before which every true and noble man bows the knee. Equity and impartiality constitute the fundamental ideal of citizenship. In this age of merciless competition the ideal of absolute justice to every man his due, nothing more, nothing less, is the dominating spirit of economic and political relationship. But there is a higher law, a law springing from a broader and nobler conception of life, which is beginning to permeate our social consciousness and even to modify our narrow idea of the obligations of the individual to society and the state. It is the law of unselfish service to humanity.

Contrasted with the spirit of demagoguism, the higher law seeks the calls for ability and honesty, and invites for every act the highest light of publicity. With no ulterior motives, its single aim is to serve the common good. Throughout all history the men who have observed the higher law have been, without exception, the forerunners of good. Alfred the Great, Charlemagne, Gustavus Adolphus, Gladstone—each name calls to mind a strong character and a life of noble, unselfish devotion to mankind. And in our own country such men have not been wanting. The United States, even from the days of Washington, Adams and Jefferson, has been extremely fortunate in always having in its service so many men of large abilities and noble character. The light which shone in the lives of such men as Patrick Henry and Abraham Lincoln has never been dimmed, and in our own day, into the lives of such men as Roosevelt and Hughes, has come a new conception of their higher duty, and they have set their faces resolutely against all perversion of the nobler ideals of our nation. But in no period of our history has there been so great a demand as exists today for men who will recognize their responsibility to the higher law of unselfish public service. America needs men today who are able and willing to administer the affairs of government with efficiency. We are in the midst of a great ethical revival. The crying need of our land is for men of high ideals and noble courage.

"Tall men, sun-crowned, who live above the fog
In public duty and private thinking."
The United States, however, has many men of integrity who are eminently well fitted to lead in governing the nation; but they go into commercial life because they can gratify their desire to succeed and become powerful.

Men Love Power

The love of power is a motive which actuates every healthy, active man, and is no doubt the predominating motive in the pursuit of wealth. Men enter the business world because they can there work unhindered; because men and money are at their bidding, and because they can here find gratification for the passion of mastery. Such attractions are not to be found in the world of politics. The position of the executive is hampered by a complex and unwieldy political mechanism, and his power is greatly limited. The salaries are by no means commensurate with the work to be done. The mayor or the governor has but a short term in which to serve, and he dare not make any far-reaching plans because reelection is uncertain. Moreover the conditions which have at times characterized our political lives have been such that no man could take part in politics and maintain his integrity. It is hardly strange, therefore, that the administration of public business is not inviting to the able man of affairs.

Realizing this deplorable condition in our American life, the wisest men are beginning to ask whether it is not possible to attract to the admin-
