HARRISBURG MAN WANTS DAMAGES FROM S. P.

Claims That Wing Dams Have Changed River and Cut Off His Land

J. R. Cartwright, of Harrisburg, has sued the Southern Pacific for \$16,104 damages, with M. L. Pipes, of Portland, and Woodcock & Smith, of Eugene, as his attorneys. He charges that because of four wing dams 200 to 300 feet long and certain rock in the channel of the river near the bridge at Harrisburg the channel of the river was changed so as to run on the four hundred acres of the defendant, and that thereby 48.05 acres was cut off, 14.36 acres, 13.82 acres and 19 acres, all of the value of \$300 an acre, destroyed. That \$500 damage was done by the division and \$1000 damage by drift wood, etc., making a total of \$16,104 damages.

FAMOUS SOUTHERN SENATOR DIES

John W. Daniel, Soldier, Lawyer and Statesman, Passes Away

Lynchburg, Va., June 25.—John W. Daniel, senior senator from Virginia, died at Lynchburg sanitarium at 10:35 o'clock tonight. The immediate cause of death was cerebral hemorrhage, following a recurrence of paralysis.

Senator Daniel was one of the best known figures in the upper house, having seen continuous service there since the term beginning March 4, 1887. He was a member of the National Monetary commission of the 61st Congress and took an active part in affairs as a member of the democratic side of the senate.

Lynchburg, Senator Daniel's home at the time of his death, was also the place of his birth, September 5, 1842. He received his education in private schools and colleges of Lynchburg, and in May, 1861, entered the Confederate army as Second Lieutenant in the "Stonewall" brigade. He was wounded four times during the war, the first occasion being the battle of Manassas. He later became first lieutenant and adjutant of the regiment. He was promoted to major and chief of staff of General Jubal A. Early, on which he served until permanently crippled in the Wilderness, May 6, 1864.

After the war, Senator Daniel studied law at the University of Virginia and practiced with his father, Judge William Daniel, Jr., until 1873. He was made doctor of laws by Washington and Lee University and the University of Michigan. He was the author of "Daniel on Attackments" and "Daniel on Negotiable Instruments."

Senator Daniel's first political service was from 1869 to 1872, during which period he was a member of the Virginia house of delegates. He was a member of the state senate from 1875 to 1881, was democratic elector at large in 1876, and was delegate-at-large to national democratic conventions of 1880, 1888, 1892, 1896, 1900 and 1904. In 1891 he was democratic candidate for nomination for governor of Virginia, but was defeated by William E. Cameron.

Senator Daniel was elected representative in the 49th congress in 1884, and in 1887 was elected to the senate to succeed William Mahone. He served continuously in the senate up to his death. His term would have expired March 3, 1911.
