ODD FELLOWS AND REBEKAHS PLAN BIG PICNIC ON JULY 24

Will Drive Out to Christener's
 Grove, Five Miles West
 of Eugene

Eugene Odd Fellows and Rebekahs are planning a big picnic at Christener's grove, five or six miles west of the city, on Sunday, July 24. They will drive out early in the forenoon, eat their lunch under the wide-spreading trees of the grove, and commune with nature. This grove, which is located near the pass where the Lane County Asset Company's railroad survey is made, is ideally situated for a gathering of this kind. The three-linkers are anticipating a fine time, and it is expected that several hundred will attend. The people residing in that vicinity are invited to attend if they bring along well-filled baskets, as the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs expect to do.

NEW MACHINERY FOR COTTAGE GROVE ELECTRIC PLANT

The fine new machinery for the Cottage Grove Electric Light Company arrived last week and is rapidly being installed. The new improvement to the water plant consists of the very latest type of McNaull's water tube boiler with a 400 horse-power capacity and capable of carrying 600 horse-power if necessary. The boiler is 18 feet in length, below which is the furnace. The boiler base occupies a space of 11x20 feet and when mounted on its concrete base ready to be steamed up it will be 16 feet in length. The smoke stack is 48 inches in diameter, 80 feet high and weighs four or five tons. Fred Rivears, an expert machinist, of Portland, is here directing the installation of this fine new machinery, which also includes the new Cooke's water heater. This new equipment, together with the new poles, lines and arcs, will give Cottage Grove one of the best and most modern electric light and power plants in the Willamette valley, and Messrs. Kem and Shinn are to be congratulated upon their enterprise and progressiveness. They are giving proof that they mean to keep up with the march of progress in this city, which they have selected as not only a place to engage in a business enterprise, but also in which to establish permanent homes.—Leader.

SWEET PEA SHOW AT COTTAGE GROVE

Cottage Grove, Or., July 6.—The civic improvement committee of the Women's Club, which has in charge the third annual sweet pea show, has fixed the time of same for July 8 and 9. Prizes will be given for the finest sweet peas, roses, potted plants and collections of flowers. MRS. McMURPHEY GETS MOTHER'S FORTUNE

Mrs. Shelton Left Estate Valued at \$73,000 to Her Daughter

Portland, July 7.—County Judge T. J. Cleaton this forenoon admitted to the probate will of Mrs. Adah L. Shelton, whose death occurred in Portland on June 30. The estate, which is valued at \$73,000, is given to W. D. Fenton, as executor of the will to be held in trust for the only daughter of the deceased, Mrs. Alberta Shelton McMURPHEY, of Eugene, during her life and then to be divided among her children, of whom there are six. The estate consists of \$60,000 in personal property, \$12,000 in real estate in Lane county and \$1,000 in real estate in Linn county. The executor is instructed to dispose of the real estate and invest the entire amount in good interest bearing securities, stocks and bonds. C. W. Pallett, Frank Lucas and C. G. Moores are named as appraisers. The will was made on October 30, 1903.

SOUTHERN PACIFIC'S TERMINAL BONDS

Twenty-five Million Dollar Issue Is Placed on the Market

New York, July 7.—Subscriptions for the new \$25,000,000 issue of Southern Pacific San Francisco Terminal first mortgage 4 per cent. gold bonds are payable today. The bonds were sold at 93 and accrued interest, and will fall due in 1950. Kuhn, Loeb & Company are handling the New York issue. Simultaneous issues were made in Berlin, Frankfurt, Hamburg, London, Basel, Zurich and Amsterdam.

FOURTEEN NEGROES LOSE THEIR LIVES

Chicago, July 6.—Riots of minor degree, but fraught with perilous possibilities, have broken out all over the country following the Jeffries-Johnson fight at Reno. The latest dispatches from various sources show that 14 negroes have been killed. Two white men are dead and there are broken heads and men wounded by razors, clubs and bullets by the score.

In this city 50 "bad" negroes were arrested at the first ebullition and locked up to prevent trouble. They will part with their winnings on the fight in the police courts and may be cooled off by that time. More trouble is expected here Thursday, when Johnson arrives. He will be greeted by two bands, the Eighth Regiment (colored), and the Colored Elks' band, and there will be a parade of 60 automobiles.
