ANNIVERSARY OF GREAT PRIZE FIGHT

Story of Sullivan-Kilrain Battle at New Orleans Is Retold

New Orleans, July 8.—There were giants in those days"—meeting the latter quarter of the nineteenth century. The recent heavy weight controversy has set the tongues of the ancient sports a-wagging about the "good old times" when the mighty John L. Sullivan and the game Jacob Kilrain settled their differences of opinion. Today is the twenty-first anniversary of that conflict of gladiators, which took place at Richburg, Miss., July 8, 1889, after the fighters and fans had played a game of hide-and-seek with the lawfully constituted authorities of two states.

That was some fight. Many old New Orleans sports believe that if Kilrain had been in as good condition as his opponent, John L., would have gone down to defeat that day. Be that as it may, as the leading writers say, it was a fight, all right.

When the gong sounded to begin the historic conflict of science and brute strength, principally the latter—John L. led off with his terrible bull-like rushes. Kilrain immediately hit him on the nose with a hard straight left, backhanded him heavily to the ground. It was London prize ring rules. For three rounds Kilrain had the best of it. Then his illness appeared. His strength began to wane. Sullivan, curious from the unexpected beating he received at the start, turned the tide of battle with savage rushes, smacking Kilrain heavily in the clinches.

But Jake Kilrain was a game man, although he was outclassed. He fought hard all the way. The fight ended in the seventy-fifth round. Kilrain, who had just been knocked about the ring and sent down hard time after time without making much resistance, was unable to leave his corner and Mike Donovan his second, threw up the sponge.

It was a vicious fight. In the middle of it Sullivan, who had taken fierce punishment about the body, began to vomit, and it was thought that he would have to quit. But he recovered, and after that fought savagely, often coming dangerously close to the foul line. Once he threw Kilrain and jumped on him with both knees, like a football player.

FIGHTING GAME NOT DEAD, SAYS GOV. DICKERSON

Reno, July 7.—The fighting game is not dead in Reno, as a result of the battle on the Fourth, in the opinion of Governor Dickerson, as expressed to the United Press today.

"Billy Muldoon, the famous old sporting man, paid a compliment which was highly appreciated by Nevada," said the governor, "when he referred to our state as the 'one remaining state in the Union whose citizens are still free.' The governor occupied a ring-side seat at the fight.
