THIEF BUSY STEALING PARTS OF BICYCLES

Makes It a Point to Take Only the Seat, Lamp or Oother Detachable Part

Don't feel safe when you lock your bicycle, but chain up all the equipment and everything detachable if you don't want it stolen. There seems to be a thief or set of thieves who are making a practice of stealing not the wheel, but the lamp or seat or some detachable part.

Last Saturday night about 9 o'clock when Harold Young, who was working in the Linn drug store, looked for his wheel that he left locked in the alley near the store, he found it gone, but upon searching he found it at the intersection of the alleys in the rear of the store, but minus its seat. The wheel had been carried there and the seat, which was a new \$7 saddle, was gone.

Paul Dommergues reports the

same thing happening to his wheel when he left in on Ninth street the night before, only he came for it just in time and after he had heard the men running, and he found the seat half detached.

William Brower, mailer at the Guard office, had the lamp stolen off his bicycle one night last week while the wheel stood beside the office where he was working. It is much more difficult to identify or find these parts of the wheels than it would be if the whole bicycle was stolen. There have been other instances of this kind heard of recently, and it evidently is the work of the same party, who learns that the owner of the wheel will not be around for a few moments and so removes some part that is saleable and that would be difficult to identify.

PRAISE LANE COUNTY'S GOOD HIGHWAYS

Say Road Up McKenzie Is Extremely Good and Free From Steep Hills

A party of Portland automobilists recently passed through Eugene on the road to and from the upper McKenzie resorts. A writeup of the trip in Sunday's Oregonian appears and in it are several compliments to Lane county's roads and Eugene. A portion of the article is as follows: "On the next day they passed through Eugene, lunched at Deershorn, visited the government salmon hatchery and reached Foley Springs as the dinner horn sounded. The road up the McKenzie river is extremely good and free from steep hills. It follows the windings of the river on an even grade, and is shaded by a forest of giant firs. Many followers of Isaac Walton were seen casting the fly, and those within hailing distance were asked to show their creel, which bespoke the truth that the McKenzie is one of the world's best trout streams.

Hot Springs Enticing.

"To Lane county much credit is due in the original laying out and maintenance of her roads. The grades are as painstakingly laid out as a railroad survey; scenic effects are not overlooked and the future will see this wilderness visited by many pleasure seekers with rod and camera. The original forests border the river, and the timber wealth of this region is enormous. The botanist will find, from the source of the McKenzie to the mouth, enough specimens to fill his herbarium. With glass and press, the student need spend no idle moments.

Nature's Beauty Preserved.

"With nothing else to recommend the beautiful site of our Oregon university, this fact alone, of its receiving the blessings of the last rush of the virgin waters of our snow-covered Cascades, is sufficiently inspiring. Oregon is Oregon still in the valley of the McKenzie. The hand of man has only lent encouragement to a journey along its scenic shores.

"At Deershorn lunch was enjoyed. If one does not plan to reach here during the regular meal hours, he should telephone from Leaburg going in or from Blue River coming out, and a delay is overcome. At Waverlyville, a game of baseball was in progress between Eugene and the home team, and great enthusiasm prevailed. From there a direct run to Eugene was made, where the town and adjoining country were gathered for Independence day festivities. Take your cap off when passing through Eugene; she's a hummer!"

YOUTH DISAPPEARS TO DODGE HIS WEDDING

Vale, Or., July 11.—A double wedding was spoiled by the sudden disappearance here a few days ago of John Williams, of Bellevue, Idaho, one of the prospective bridegrooms. James Park and Miss Pennington, the other couple, were married on time, but Miss Park, sister of the bridegroom at the wedding, waited in vain for the missing man, and is still unwed. The sheriff sought for Williams, as foul play was feared, but the following day the missing man appeared at his home, and no explanation is vouchsafed by him or his parents as to his strange behavior.
