Cottage Grove, July 13.—Albert Ziniker, who was severely injured by a powder explosion in the Bohemia mines Monday morning, resulting in the injury of his eyesight and various bruises about the body, was brought down to this city at midnight last night and taken to the Holland hotel, where he is resting easily. The doctor is hopeful for the restoration or preservation of his sight. Mrs. Ziniker will return from the mines today.

It seems that Mr. Ziniker was working in his blacksmith shop on his mining property and previously some giant powder had been placed on his forge to dry out, when some of the glycerine from the powder ran down in the coal, and when the fire was kindled, exploded, hurling coal and cinders in Mr. Ziniker's face and also bruising his arm and side. It is feared he may lose one eye.

### FAMOUS IRISH PRISON PUT OUT OF COMMISSION

Dublin, July 13.—Kilmainham goal, a historic prison which in its time has been the home of many of the most famous Irish political agitators, was formally put out of commission today and will likely never be reopened.

For some time the structure has been practically tenantless, owing to the decrease in crime and criminals. During the troubled days of 1880 Kilmainham received hosts of "suspects," arrested under the coercion act, of which Glasstone was the author. Parnell himself and a number of his lieutenants were among the prisoners at this time. It was from Kilmainham that the famous defiant counsel to the tenant farmers of Ireland, interpreted by the unionist party as a "no-rent manifesto," was issued.

It was while Parnell and his colleagues were in Kilmainham that the negotiations with the government took place, which are said to have resulted in what was called the "Kilmainham treaty."

Mr. Parnell was in Kilmainham from Oct. 13, 1881, to May 2, 1882. On the day of his release Mr. Foster resigned the chief secretaryship. He would not, he said, "give up coercion." Earl Cowper at the same time relinquished the office of viceroy.

The new viceroy, Earl Spencer, entered Dublin on the 6th. With him was the new chief secretary, Lord Frederick Cavendish.

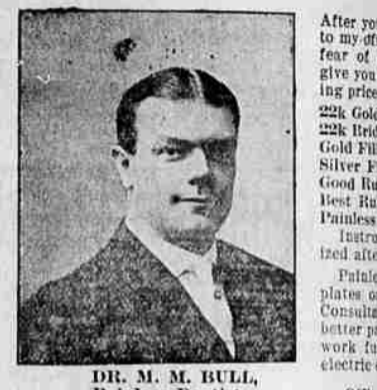

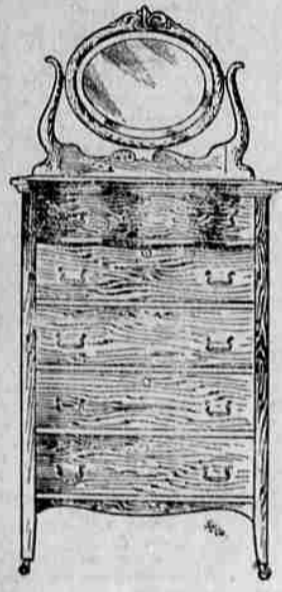
