REPORT OF SIUSLAW

JETTY ENGINEER FOR MONTH OF JUNE

Tells Amount of Material Used and Progress of the Work

Following is the report of the engineer on the Siuslaw Jetty work for June:

The Port of Siuslaw Commission, Florence, Or.

Gentlemen: The following is a report of operations in the improving of the entrance to Siuslaw river for the month of June, 1910, contract of Robert Wakefield, dated Dec. 24, 1909:

Work was in progress during the entire month, the weather conditions were very favorable and a good rate of progress was maintained.

The jetty tramway was extended seaward a distance of 705 feet during the month, and the sea end bent is now No. 67, or a total distance of 1005 feet from the wharf.

The first delivery of stone was made on June 15 and with few exceptions daily deliveries were made during the balance of the month. No brush mattresses have so far been placed in the work, but their use will be begun in the immediate future.

The following materials have been placed in the work by the contractor during the month: Piles, 5182 lineal feet; lumber, 76,711 feet board measure; drift bolts, 3539 pounds; wire or ship spikes, 300 pounds; old rails relaid, 16,810 tons; railroad spikes, 600 pounds; stone, 2947 tons.

Monthly estimate No. 3 covering the above amount of materials is forwarded to you herewith for payment. Very respectfully,

FIVE MEN DOOMED TO BE HANGED

Salem, Or., July 12.—The death cells at the state penitentiary are filling up rapidly and now five men, some not at the prison, however, are doomed to be hanged this summer.

Superintendent C. W. James has just prepared his penitentiary report for the quarter, and, while those to suffer for capital crimes are increasing, the number of convicts has dropped to 406 from 416. Earnings of the prison show a total of \$650.65 and expenditures were \$14,972.64. For the penitentiary betterment fund \$955.63 was realized and repairs and improvements cost \$1987.27. Total expenditures for the quarter were \$17,015.54.

The men to be hanged include John D. Roseville of Washington county; James A. Harrod, brought to Salem today from Lakeview; James A. Casaday, brought here from eastern Oregon recently, and two Chinamen, who are now in the Multnomah county jail.

ANOTHER STAMP

MILL AT BOHEMIA

Another stamp mill will be in operation in the Bohemia mining district within thirty days. Lewis Hartley, who has a number of claims in Saylor's gulch, has bought a Nissen one-stamp mill, and the same was received from Seattle Monday. It is an entirely new pattern and, having a 1300-pound stamp, is guaranteed by the manufacturer to have a greater capacity than the ordinary 5-stamp mill. He has also bought and has received a six-horsepower gasoline engine with which to operate the mill. During the past month a sled road a mile in length has been blasted to Saylor's gulch, this work having been found necessary in order to get the new machinery into the camp.—Leader.

NEW ROAD SOON TO BE OPENED

Hon. M. A. Miller, who was in the city, reported big preparations for a celebration for the opening of the new road between Crabtree and Lebanon and as well Springfield and Woodburn by way of Lebanon. It will occur next Saturday night. Manager J. P. O'Brien and other prominent officials will be present and several from Albany have been specially invited. It will be kept up in some shape.—Albany Democrat.

TO SUCCEED REED

Taft Promises to Name Local Republican as United States Marshal of Oregon

Portland, Oregon, July 13.—Elmer B. Colwell, of Portland, will be appointed to succeed C. J. Reed as United States marshal for the district of Oregon. The information is contained in a letter to Dr. Henry Walden Howard Taft, president of the United States.

As a sequel to the information becoming public Mr. Colwell has been tendered the congratulations of his friends, but has consistently refused to accept felicitations. "Barkis is willin'," but until the announcement comes from the white house the successful applicant for the position neither confirms or denies the impeachment.

The present incumbent, C. J. Reed, will arrive in the city today, and rumor has it that his political sponsor, Francis J. Heney, will either be on the same train or will closely follow Mr. Reed.

Mr. Colwell is now connected with the irrigation projects of Dr. Coe at Stanfield, Or., and for the last week both of the gentlemen have been in Umatilla county looking after the interests of land colonization. Prior to the departure, Dr. Coe exhibited the letter to friends in Portland, and feels secure in the promise from the president. Whether the appointment will be made during the vacation of congress, or whether President Taft proposes to wait until after December next before naming the next marshal of this district is not made clear.
