CIRCULAR SAW FLIES TO PIECES

Springfield, July 15.—A large circular saw in the mill of the Fischer-Bally Co. flew to pieces while running at a high rate of speed Wednesday afternoon and only by a chance it happened that many of the men working around it were not hit and killed by the flying pieces. The biggest piece, fully half the saw, crashed twenty feet through a big brace timber of the mill and after its force was spent fell flat side on the head of one of the workmen, West Truban, knocking him senseless and cutting his back. Another small piece went hurtling through the air between two small boys who were playing close together outside the mill without striking either. It is considered very fortunate that none were killed by the hundreds of pieces of steel that were shot through the air among the men by the terrific centrifugal force. If the piece that fell on Truban had hit his head edge-wise it would have gone through his skull. He was only bruised.

CHANGES OF TRAINS ON EAST SIDE BRANCH

Springfield, July 14.—Although it has not been definitely announced from the Southern Pacific offices at Portland, it is pretty well understood by the train men what the changes will be because of the completion of the Santiam bridge allowing the Springfield trains on the east side to

go to Woodburn as they did before the wash-out of the bridge occurred. One thing that will be very satisfactory to the passenger service will be to abolish the mixed freight and passenger trains. A freight train will be run every other day while there will be the daily service to Woodburn with one passenger train. Notwithstanding reports to the contrary, it is the general opinion that the gasoline motor will not be changed from the run from here to Albany or on the Wendling service. The through passenger train to Woodburn rather than Albany is generally preferred.

Springfield Brevities

Springfield, July 15.—Track laying on this end of the street car line where the lighter rails have been replaced by the new ones was finished this morning and new steel on the line now is all the same weight.

The second bridge pier will be finished today sometime and there is only the one other middle pier to complete now. This can be finished easily next week and then the timbers can be placed.

A meeting of the commercial club will be held tonight and there are a number of important matters that will be brought up. One of these will be the matter of the city's promotion work and how to spend the money that has been raised for advertising purposes. The promotion committee, consisting of Winzenried, Kestly and Perry, were out this afternoon among the subscribers getting the opinions as to the method in which the city publicity should be carried on for the rest of this year.

BE CAREFUL OF THE EUCALYPTUS GRAFT

That Is the Warning Being Sent
Out Now By Forester
Graves

Declaring that some companies engaged in the planting of the eucalyptus tree in this country have endeavored to place the government behind exaggerated statements as to the possible results, Forester Graves has issued a warning to the public against extravagant predictions.

"Within the last few years," Mr. Graves says, "there have been organized a considerable number of companies for planting eucalyptus on a large scale. While many of them have planned their operations along lines which will bring commercial success, others are beginning to estimate returns far beyond reasonable expectations. Some of them make claims regarding the possible yield per acre within ten or twelve years, which are believed to be entirely extravagant. Some of them maintain that within a short period a product can be secured which is equal in value and price to that of Australian eucalyptus obtained from virgin forests. The forest service repeatedly

has been misquoted in the circulars of eucalyptus companies and an effort made to place the government behind exaggerated statements."

In order to settle the disputed question as to how a large yield can be obtained, the forest service and the state of California have joined in an investigation of representative groves. The result of this study, which it is expected will be available in the fall, will form a basis to determine the commercial possibilities of the tree.

Eucalyptus is an Australian tree. It has been introduced in Southern California and portions of Florida and Texas.
