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TEACHER OF HINDU RELIGION IS CHARGED WITH ABDUCTION

New York, July 16.—Omnipotence and omniscience will be opposed to finite intelligence in New York next week, when Pierre A. Bernard, otherwise known as "Oom the Omnipotent," will be placed on trial on an indictment charging abduction. Whether his all-seeing eye will enable him to convince the jury of his innocence is a matter for such grave doubt that "Oom" has engaged a common or garden earthly lawyer to conduct his defense.

Bernard conducted a so-called institute in West Seventy-fourth street, where he gave instruction to women in an alleged Hindu religion and the art of curing ills without drugs. For the female "initiates" he had a special course, very occult and mysterious, and which apparently received its sanction from the chronicles of Boocaccio, rather than the Hindu sacred books.

One of his alleged victims was Zella Hopp, who caused his arrest on the abduction charge. "Oom" was formerly a resident of Portland, Ore., and evidence as to his practices in that city will be brought out at the trial.

Dr. Freeman's Theory.

Records of Chauffeurs.

New York chauffeurs are "up in the air," metaphorically speaking, pending the investigation now going on into their ability, records, habits, deportment and antecedents. The new Callan automobile law, which provides that licenses may be granted only to chauffeurs who are properly qualified, goes into effect two weeks hence, and it is likely that many men who are now "chuffing" cars on the streets of Gotham will find themselves minus an occupation.

Secretary of State Koenig has opened a branch office in New York city, and is determined that the new law shall be rightly enforced in the metropolis.

"I have selected a number of examiners," said Secretary Koenig, "who will examine all applicants for license as chauffeurs. Examinations will be held in different parts of the state during July and careful scrutiny will be given prospective chauffeurs. Those who are known to the police of various cities as reckless drivers, men who have been in many accidents due to their own negligence, will not be granted a license. The public will be accorded the greatest possible protection from imprudent and careless drivers, and the men who will act as examiners will see to it that no man receive a license who does not fulfill all the requirements of the law. Upon conviction of a reckless driver the court may recommend the revocation of his license, and in all such cases the secretary of state has power to revoke it."

To Break Queer Will.

A legal attempt to break one of the queerest wills ever filed will be made soon by the half-sisters of Miss Elizabeth Bastian, an eccentric spinster, who died recently. The dead woman asked that her entire fortune be spent in erecting a magnificent resting place for her body. The vault was to be her exclusive property, and under no circumstances was any other body to be placed therein.

Convinced that she would never die, that the so-called death is merely a transition from one state of life to another, and wishing to have a dwelling of some pretension in her expected new life, Miss Bastian ordered in her will that a mausoleum

be erected for her at a cost of \$50,000. She cut off most of her relatives with only \$1 apiece.

The relatives are now making efforts to have the will revoked on the ground that when Miss Bastian made it she was of unsound mind. The fact that she ordered the construction of a \$50,000 mausoleum and entertained the belief that she would never die, are advanced as evidences of her mental condition.
