IMPORTANT CONFERENCE ON RAILROAD RATES

Representatives of all Leading Roads of the Country Are Present

Washington, July 15.—A conference on the recent railway rate discussions of the Interstate Commerce Commission, perhaps the most important and far-reaching handed down in the history of that body, brought to Washington today representatives of all the leading and transcontinental and western lines. The railroad men are up in arms against the decisions, and voiced their displeasure before the commission today. It is expected, however, that the commissioners will remain firm, unless better reasons are adduced than have so far been presented.

The commission has ordered extensive reductions of freight rates west of the Missouri river, especially in the inter-mountain and Pacific states. These reductions are the most comprehensive that the commission ever

made and will effect all transcontinental lines.

The bulk, if not all, the burden of the reductions, however, will fall upon roads operating west of the Mississippi, whose rates have been relatively higher than those of the roads of the East.

The commission has not, however, taken this important step without exercising a great deal of caution. It has provided for the postponement of the effective date of its more important orders until October 1.

In the meantime the roads affected, acting under the commission's orders, will keep two sets of revenue accounts, one showing the revenue at the present rates, and another the figures as they will stand at the reduction ordered by the commission.

This comparative data is to be submitted before October 1, and through this actual test the commission believes that it will be able to verify the soundness of the decisions that the present rates are unreasonable.

The decisions handed down involve what is popularly known as the Pacific Coast cases. The cases were heard last fall on the commission's six-weeks' trip to the Pacific coast and inter-mountain territory, and have been under consideration ever since. The commission orders a reduction of rates in practically every case complained of. In some instances they amount to close to 50 percent. The long and short haul question is involved in most of the commission's present decisions.

The commission invites from the railroads any criticisms of its schedule, to be filed with the commission on or before one month from today.

Circular Letter Is Issued by the Tax Commission to This Effect

In his letter it is stated that observation of several assessors' reports has shown a tendency on the part of some to overlook mortgage notes and the commission states, where it is known that this is a practice of the assessors, it is but natural for holders of such notes to conceal them from the assessors.

It is urged that the assessors be careful of intangible personality and assess it with great care.
