PUBLIC REJOICES OVER BIRTHDAY

Queen Dowager of Spain Is Fifty-two Years of Age

Madrid, July 21.—Public rejoicing today marked the fifty-second birthday of Maria Christina, dowager queen of Spain and mother of King Alfonso. She received many handsome gifts from members of nearly all the reigning families of Europe. The dowager queen favors the progressive program of her royal son, and, while she has always been a favorite, this attitude has served to increase the love and respect entertained for her by the masses of the Spanish people.

She was born July 21, 1858, and is the second daughter of the late Archduke Charles of Austria. She married on Nov. 22, 1879, Alfonso XII, King of Spain, as his second wife, and upon his death, Nov. 25, 1885, she was appointed regent. Her son, the present king, was born May 17, 1886, and Maria Christina ruled the country as queen regent until he attained his majority. Her affection for her son, as well as her patriotic devotion to the welfare of her adopted country, have made her extremely popular among all classes in Spain. She is a kind and charitable woman, and so lovable that when she appears in public the people often press forward to kiss the hem of her gown.

ROOSEVELT'S MAGAZINE BARRED FROM SALE AT HUTCHINSON, KANSAS

Hutchinson, Kan., July 21.—The latest issue of the Outlook Magazine has been barred from sale in this city because of an editorial article written by Theodore Roosevelt. Recently an ordinance was passed by the city council prohibiting prize fight pictures, newspapers containing stories of prize fights, and magazines, books or pamphlets containing articles or references to pugilistic combats. Because of the editorial comment in the Outlook on the Reno prize fight, the magazine came in conflict with the ordinance and the publication was barred from sale.

BUILDING LARGEST OCEAN STEAMERS

Olympic and Titanic Will Eclipse All Former Efforts

London, July 21.—The wonders of the sea, the Lusitania and the Mauretania, will soon be relegated to the has-been class. Gigantic as they are, they will be eclipsed in size and doubtless in speed by the two new Olympic White Star liners, the Olympic and Titanic, now building at Belfast. Close on their heels comes the announcement that the Cunard line, not to be outdone, is contemplating a 50,000-ton monster. In the hope that the new Cunarders will have Liverpool as its terminus, if proper accommodations can be provided, the Liverpool board of trade held a meeting today to urge the speedy completion of the \$15,000,000 dock extension. When this great dock is finished, it will accommodate vessels 1,100 feet in length—considerably longer than the proposed successor to the present world's greatest liners.

The Mauretania and Lusitania are vessels of 32,000 tons and a length of 762 feet. The Olympic and Titanic will each have a tonnage of 45,000 and a length of 8660 feet.

Work on the latter vessels is progressing rapidly at Belfast, and the Olympic will be ready for launching within three months. All the iron work of the structure is completed to the shelter deck, which is the highest continuous deck in the ship, and the bridge, deck plating and riveting is well advanced. An idea of the progress of the shell sidings are already fitted in the vessel. The erection of stateroom framing on some of the decks is also well under way.

An important item in such a huge vessel is, of course, the stairways, and already those of the second and third class are completed up to the shelter deck. The main first-class stairway will excel anything yet seen in the art of the shipbuilder. Internal work is proceeding in connection with the fitting of sanitary and air pipes, tank suction, water-tight doors, etc.

Perhaps the most interesting news of all, however, is that the lying launchways are fitted fore and aft, and the builders have commenced putting the sidings ways into place. Thus early are they preparing for the launching, which will take place in October.

The shell plating and deck plating of the Titanic are also well under way. Quite an army of workmen is employed both day and night on these vessels, and in the various shops connected with them every day marks an important advance in construction. The construction of the machinery is keeping pace with that of the hull.

ANOTHER STRIKE MADE IN BOHEMIA

Cottage Grove, Or., July 21.—M. F. Wyatt and son came in from their mining property in the Bohemia district yesterday, bringing samples of very rich ore from a strike made on the Sunset group Saturday. The ledge is about eight feet wide from wall to wall, with a two-foot pay streak, containing gold, copper, lead and silver, and is pronounced by experienced miners to be as good as any ore ever brought out of Bohemia. Mr. Wyatt and son have been doing development work on this group for the past six years, driving on the vein for 200 feet and tapping the ore shoot at that distance.
