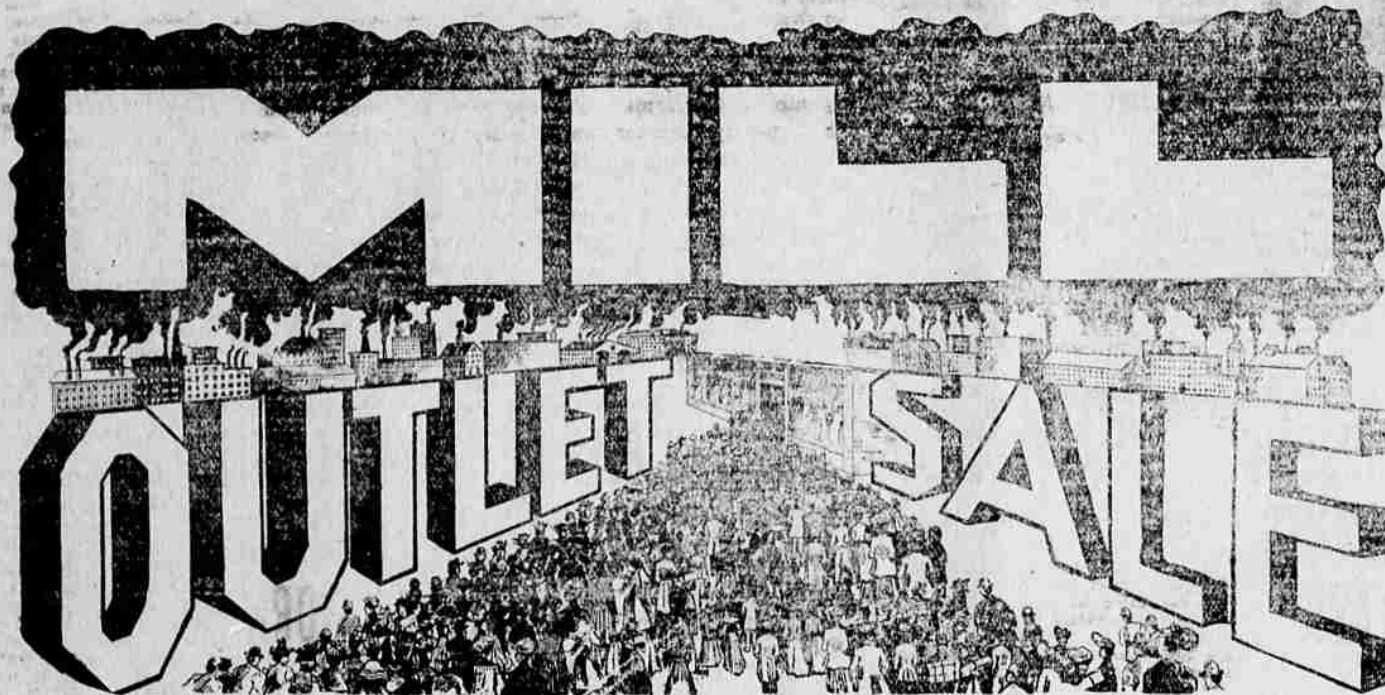

SMITH TIMBER CASE IN JUDGE'S HANDS

Title to Fifty Claims Rests With Jurist in the Federal Court at Portland

Portland, Or., July 28.—Argument of the Smith timber case closed yesterday afternoon in the federal court and Judge Bean now has under advisement an issue which involves titles to 50 timber claims in Linn and Lane counties, worth anywhere from \$800,000 to \$1,000,000. Senator John M. Gearin closed for the defense and the United States district attorney for the government.

Sensor Gearin's line of argument was that there was no fraud in the first instance, as neither Smith nor Kribs knew of any defect in methods of location when they first negotiated for the lands. The attorney further insisted that the price paid for the lands was as much as such lands could be sold for in the local markets at the time, which was evidence of good faith on the part of the Smith interests. This primary innocence at the time the entries were made, and the fact that a full consideration was paid, Senator Gearin believed, placed the defendants above all suspicion of fraud such as the government required before cancelling patents issued.

District Attorney McCourt closed in a brief argument for the government. His position was that while it must be conceded that Smith and Kribs had nothing to do with the location of these claims when entry was made, yet the peculiar transactions occurring after investigation began was proof of some guilty conduct and knowledge, which was sufficient to constitute fraud. He defended his contention that the government could recover the value of lands, where prevented from proceeding to cancel title by the statute of limitations, and also insisted that the present holding company of the lands is a Smith concern, and is charged with all the notice that could be laid at the door of Mr. Smith himself and his agents.

SANTIAM FOREST FIRE NOW UNDER CONTROL

Albany, Or., July 29.—After causing the loss of three lives and destroying 3,000,000 feet of timber and machinery valued at \$500,000, the Santiam forest fire was yesterday reported to be under control. It was checked by the digging of five miles of trenches which prevented further spread of the flames among the humus covering the soil.

The fire started on July 19, near Hoover, on the Corvallis & Eastern railroad, and is said to have been the result of carelessness on the part of employees of the Hoover Lumber company, which is the greatest loser. Employees of the company failed to clear a space around the donkey engine or to connect the water hose which is kept as a safeguard against fire. The men are said to have lost their heads in attempting to couple the hose, the entire plant being burned. Seventy men are employed in fighting the fire, Forest Supervisor Sherrard being in charge of the work.

GREAT CLAMBAKE AT NEWPORT, OR.

Newport, Or., July 28.—Newport will have a large clam-bake on August 14. Mrs. Lee Williams and Mrs. Gene Brady, of Newport, and A. L. Clifford, of Portland, at the suggestion of Rev. J. R. N. Bell, of Corvallis, being hostesses and hosts.

The Southern Pacific company has agreed to run excursions from over the state. In 1905 over 1200 people came in on one day to feast on bivalves, and the coming event promises to be attended by a much larger crowd. Frank Priest will again serve as chef for the occasion, and the patronesses will be composed of the prominent women of Lincoln county, assisted by some who will be invited from other parts of the state.
