TELEGRAMS SENT

New York, Aug. 17.—Under a new federal law taking effect today, it is unlawful for any telegraph company to issue franks for the transmission of telegrams to any person except officials, agents and employees, and their families, of common carriers, and a few other classes specifically mentioned in the act. All complimentary, business and half-rate franks held by persons other than those excepted by the law become null and void today and will be taken up by the companies and cancelled whenever presented. The law affects both the Western Union and Postal companies. It is understood that many men of prominence, including several congressmen are deprived of their telegraph franks by the new law.
