STEAM PLOW OPERATES ON FARM NEAR CRESWELL

Pulled by 12-Horse Traction Engine—Business Changes

A steam plow owned and operated by A. M. Thompson of Portland is being operated on the Miller ranch west of Creswell. The plows, four in number, plow four inches deep and are pulled by a 12-horse Aultman-Taylor engine. Ten acres can be plowed each day, and this method of working land is coming into use every year on large tracts throughout the northwest.

The machines and engine are operated by Mr. Thompson with the assistance of one man. Mr. Thompson has followed this line of work for 15 years and has used steam plows in Texas, Oklahoma, the Dakotas, Nebraska, Kansas and other states in the west and northwest. He is at present in Portland, where he is having made a set of plows of his own invention, which are superior to the kind he now uses. This is the only steam plow, so far as known, now in operation in Lane county. It will be employed on the Miller ranch until 400 of the 640 acres are plowed.

Hop Picking Aug. 20.

The yield of hops this year in R. O. Brady's yard will be the largest for several seasons past, and owing to this more pickers will be needed than heretofore. Quite a number have notified Mr. Brady of their intention to pick, but nowhere near the number required have responded. He says his yard is open to all who desire to pick, and that he does not fear securing more pickers than necessary to handle the crop. From indications at present, picking will start Aug. 29.

Stores Change Hands.

Last week a transaction was made whereby the hardware and furniture business belonging to R. H. Parsons & Co. passed into the hands of H. C. Kenney, who conducts a similar business. Mr. Kenney bought out F.

W. Ogram last winter and has greatly increased his volume of business, and by his purchase of the Parsons store now has one of the largest hardware and furniture stocks in the valley. R. H. Parsons last week purchased of H. C. Kenney the grocery the latter bought recently of E. F. Roberts. The store is now in the hands of W. W. Scott, who is conducting it for Mr. Parsons.—Chronicle.

OREGON MILITIA

GETS \$36,137

Washington, Aug. 19.—The war department today announced appropriation of \$4,000,000, the appropriation made by congress for militia of various states. Of this total fund allotted according to congressional representation and militia strength of respective states, Oregon will receive \$36,137. Washington will receive \$33,632 and Idaho \$21,032. This fund will be disbursed for the following purposes:

Arms and equipment—Oregon, \$11,736; Washington, \$14,670; Idaho, \$8,802.
Rifle practice—Oregon, \$3,912; Washington, \$4,890; Idaho, \$2,934.
Ammunition—Oregon, \$7,206; Washington, \$5,571; Idaho, \$3,745.
Supplies—Oregon, \$13,282; Washington, \$12,012; Idaho, \$5,550.

GOVERNOR DELAYS

RETURN TO OREGON

Message from Dr. Steiner Says However That Mr. Benson Is Improved in Health

Salem, Or., Aug. 18.—In a postal card received today at the executive offices from Dr. R. E. Lee Steiner, superintendent of the asylum, who is in San Francisco, it is said that Governor Benson is improved in health and is able to be out daily. This same card carries the information, however, that the governor probably will not return to Oregon until after the primaries.

Attaches of the governor's office made the statement that Superintendent Steiner was called to southern Oregon for the purpose of returning a patient from the asylum to his home, and while in the southern part of the state to make the trip to San Francisco to see the governor. Despite cheering assurances, no definite statements have been received as to the governor's condition. All of the letters received from California, which have been made public, have carried only the bare statement that the governor was improving and so far as is known no one has brought a direct statement from which might be secured any accurate knowledge of his condition.

Many of his friends still consider it strange, improved in health as the reports say he is, that he should postpone his return to Oregon until after the primary nominating elections, as indicated.

Upon the return of Dr. Steiner, which is expected shortly, it is believed that complete information of the governor's state of health may be secured.

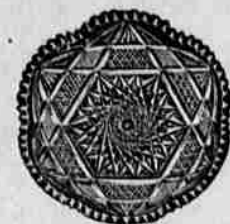
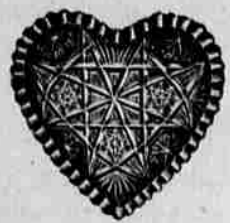
