IN THE World of Sport

ZOLOCK WINS BIG RACE AT VANCOUVER

Again an Oregon product won honors abroad when the sterling pacer, Zolock, won the special free-for-all race at Vancouver Thursday afternoon and at the same time breaking the northwest half mile track record with the greatest of all western drivers up, Sam Lindsay. Zolock won the stallion race on the same tracks last Tuesday, says the Salem Statesman.

Zolock is the sire of some of the most promising track material in the country, and prominent horsemen of the west state that it is their belief that the McKinney horse will prove one of the greatest sires of the age. Zolock made his track record of 2:05 1/4 as a 10-year-old and at the present time is 16 years old.

R. Ambush, with a trotting record as a 4-year-old of 2:30 1/4, is sired by Zolock. R. Ambush is owned by Robert Britt of this city and is at the present time in quarters at the state fair grounds. It was to the owner of R. Ambush that Mr. Young telegraphed the news of Zolock's victory, the word coming as follows:

"Vancouver, B. C. Aug. 18, 1910.—Robert B. Young: Zolock won the special free-for-all pace in two heats. Time 2:10 and 2:11. Zolock's time beats the northwest half-mile track record, Lindsay up. Wild cheers from the grandstand were given the grand old horse and Oregon's great race driver, Sam Lindsay. Texas rooker, with Rutherford up, was second. Zolock is entered again Saturday."

RALPH ROSE HAS AN ALTERCATION

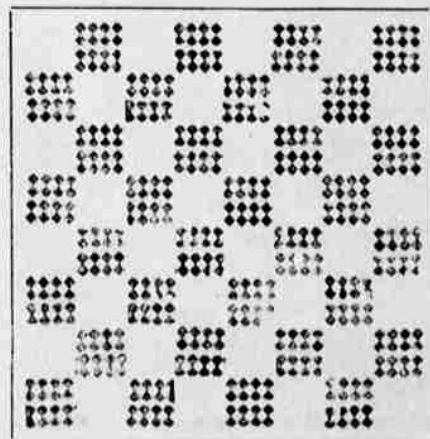
