PORTLAND PEOPLE LIKE M'KENZIE RIVER

Returned Hikers Say Scenery Is Grand and Game Plentiful
—Grouse Fly Near Tents

That the trip up the McKenzie river east of Eugene affords the most enjoyable automobile outing to be found in the state and that it will be one of the most popular drives on the Pacific coast when its attractions become known, is the opinion of A. J. Paul, who was one of a party which made the trip last week, says the Portland Journal.

Mr. Paul has traveled much all over the state in his machine and knows about as well as anyone where the best drives are to be found. Previous to making the trip he was rather skeptical when a friend tried to tell him about the wonders of the McKenzie river country. Since his return, however, he has been trying to persuade everybody else to do the same stunt.

Those who participated in the hike were Mr. and Mrs. Theodore Kruse, Richard Kruse, Fred A. Borchert and Mr. Swade, a driver, in Mr. Kruse's Packard, and Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Paul, Miss Irene McCreedie, Ray McCreedie and Mrs. Ann Borchert in A. J. Paul's Speedwell 50.

"The upper McKenzie river valley is the best place for hunting and fishing and good scenery that I have ever found," said Mr. Paul. "I was really surprised. When the beauties of the trip become known I do not see how it can become otherwise than the most popular auto drive on the coast."

"Arriving at Eugene in the middle of the afternoon we rested there over night and left Monday morning, taking dinner at O'Brien's hotel. From there we went on to Blue River, where we waited till Wednesday for the camp to be put in order. Our luggage in the meantime had been taken on ahead.

Camp in Cedar Grove.
"Our camp at Belknap, where we arrived at 2 o'clock Wednesday, was situated in a cedar grove on the banks of the stream and is one of the prettiest places to be found anywhere."

"The road to the camp branches off seven miles west of Foley Springs and the camp is about sixty miles from Eugene. It is the place where Jeffries did some of his training work. He had left all his equipment, even to the shad for jerking venison, and we had nothing to do but hunt and fish and sit down and enjoy ourselves."

"The fishing certainly was all that the most ardent nimrod could wish for. The girls in the party fished off the rocks below camp and caught enough to supply the party. We salted down ten gallons of fish, which we brought home for future consumption."

"Keeping within the law, we waited until Aug. 1 to hunt, when Roy McCreedie and Mr. Belknap went out at 3 o'clock in the afternoon and secured three deer in a few hours. There are plenty of deer in the vicinity, but the mountains are very rough and a man must know his business in order to get any game, however plentiful it may be."

"There are also plenty of grouse in the woods, but as the law does not permit shooting them at this time of the year they were not disturbed by any of our party. Numbers of them flew among our tents every day while we were encamped."

"One of the best things to be found in the vicinity are the Terwilliger sulphur springs, located about three-quarters of a mile up the mountain from where we were encamped. The mineral water in this spring is probably about the best to be found on the coast. There is a ten-inch stream of warm water, and a bathing pool has been constructed for the convenience of the visitors."

"On the sixty-mile trip from Eugene to the point where we camped the river has to be crossed five times. With the exception of the fords and a few rocks the roads are in fairly good condition and much better than the road between Portland and Salem. The run can be made easily in three hours."

Some Roads Not Good.
"If the 53 miles of roads between Portland and Salem were what they should be, the trip from the metropolis to Eugene and up the McKenzie would be as comfortable as any in the vicinity of Portland. I have traveled 3000 miles in my machine this year, but have yet struck nothing finer than the McKenzie river trip."

"Our chief, Mr. Lewis, certainly is as an AI man for camp cooking, and I wish to recommend him to anyone who needs a cook on trips in the vicinity of Eugene. We lived like princes all the time we were in camp."

"The roads between Salem and Eugene are good most of the way, although rather dusty. Between Salem and Portland they are bad, but the whole route from Portland to Eugene can be traveled in an auto in faster time than that made by the Southern Pacific trains. Returning from Eugene to Corvallis we covered the 41 miles in two hours."

BRUTAL MURDERERS OF NEWELL BOYS WILL PAY PENALTY

Klamath Falls, Or., Aug. 21.—A stay of execution of the death sentence imposed on Ike Harrell for the murder of the Newell brothers last June has been denied by the state supreme court and Harrell will pay the penalty for his crime on Sept. 9.

Harrell had been herding sheep for the Newell boys, who were 22 and 24 years of age, but had neglected to take proper care of his flocks and was discharged. Herbert Newell was writing a check for the amount due Harrell and was using his knee as a support for the checkbook, when Harrell struck him with a heavy pistol. Walter saw the act and rushed to his brother's aid. When he came near Harrell the latter shot him, killing him instantly. Harrell then shot Herbert through the shoulder, the shock of the bullet's impact felling him to the ground. He revived later and crawled to his tent where he wrote a letter describing the murder of his brother. While Herbert was in the tent, Harrell came up and shot him with a high power rifle, the bullet tearing the top of his head off.

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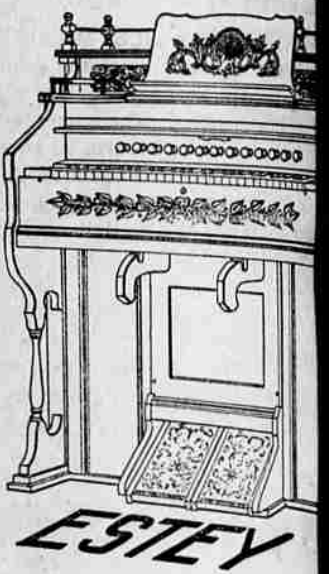
