SURVEYORS WORK DURING NIGHT AT JUNCTION

Running Lines by Aid of Candle
Inside City Limits—Wagons
from Drain

Guard Special Service. Junction City, Aug. 25.—Tuesday night about 9 o'clock the S. P. surveyors who arrived here a few days from San Francisco and are believed to be surveying for a railroad from this city to the mouth of the Siuslaw, began running a line on Front at as far as the flour mill, there going west toward their starting place at Washburne's where they commenced their survey toward the coast. It was dark at the time they commenced their work, but they had a candle lighted and set in a small can and it was used to signal and locate the proper distances wanted.

It is known for a certainty that part of the wagons they are using were shipped from Drain, Oregon, where they had been used by the Southern Pacific Company on the proposed Drain-to-coast road. They seem to be making a perfect survey and map of every foot they are going over. Wherever they come to a building of any kind on the survey they make a complete survey from every corner of the building and grounds to their line, and proceed to the next place where the same careful surveys are made. There is no longer any question but the destination of the survey is down the Lake Creek valley to the coast.

JOSEPH BEGINS SUIT TO RESTRAIN

Wishes to Have "Assembly Argument" Excluded from Pamphlet

Salem, Or., Aug. 24.—To determine whether the assembly argument recently filed with the Secretary of State shall have a place in the pamphlet under the corrupt practices act a hearing at 10 o'clock tomorrow has been set in Circuit Court before Judge William Galloway.

Papers to restrain the Secretary of State and State Printer Duniway from taking steps toward publishing the argument were filed late this afternoon with the County Clerk by George W. Joseph. W. S. U'ren was here with Joseph. It is alleged that the argument gives the assembly candidates and undue advantage.

State Printer W. S. Duniway filed a protest with the Secretary of State's office today against allowing the matter for the corrupt practices act pamphlet, as filed by J. W. Baker for W. J. Clarke, from being given a space in the booklet. In his protest was not served on the present printer as required by law and it is further stated that the nature of an objection than that of an argument and under these conditions he considers that such matter should have been placed on file by August 16. He alleges that the Clarke protest contains false statements relative to the conduct of the office and relative to the law passed by the last Legislature and the effect of the law. He states that no argument had been filed at 5 o'clock on August 22, and believes that the matter should not have space in the pamphlet.

Chf. Clerk Cory has decided to send the matter submitted to the printer, taking the stand that the Secretary of State holds merely a ministerial position and is not a judicial officer, consequently not being called upon to determine the nature of the Clarke statement, as to whether it is an objection or an argument, or whether it contains false matter prejudicial to the present printer.

Duniway protests. Charging W. J. Clarke, assembly candidate on the Republican ticket for state printer and William Baker a printer, who filed Clarke's argument advocating his nomination with the secretary of state, with misrepresentation and falsehood and a violation of the direct primary law. WILLIS S. Duniway, direct primary candidate for re-election on the Republican ticket for the same office, today filed with the secretary of state a protest against allowing the argument to be printed in the publicity pamphlet which will be sent to every registered voter.

Duniway construes the argument in addition to being favorable to Clarke's candidacy as an attack upon himself and his administration as state printer. As the direct primary law against a candidate and also provides that a copy of them must be served on the candidate attacked, he contends that the present argument being filed August 22, the latest date at which arguments can be filed favorable to a candidate and be printed in the pamphlet, is in violation of the direct primary law.

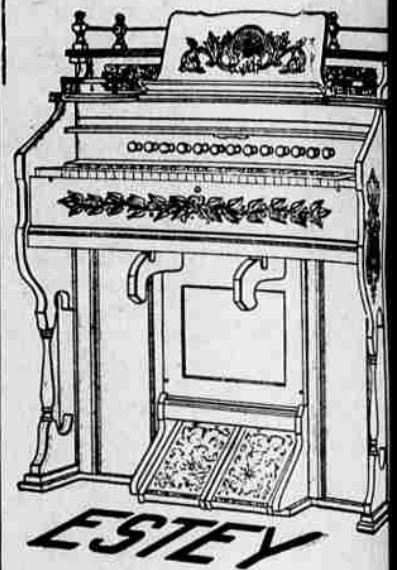
