PEOPLE ARE WAITING FOR "PINAFORE"

Much Interest Aroused in High Class Production to Be Given Soon

There are few people who are at all interested in vocal music, or who have attended the standard plays or operas, who are not more or less familiar with the story and music of the opera, H. M. S. Pinafore. There are many people however, who have formed the erroneous idea that it is some sort of a children's entertainment, but most people realize that it is one of the most beautiful and popular operas ever written, and it has been produced by more companies, both professional and amateur than any other light opera.

It was with this opera that the celebrated opera company of the United States, the Bostonians, made their leading attraction until that other beautiful opera "Robin Hood" in a measure, took its place. Still this company continued to give Pinafore for many years and it was always greeted by full houses.

Pinafore was written by Gilbert and Sullivan as a satire on the conditions then existing in the British navy, and it was largely due to this method of calling attention of the public to the incapability of some of the naval officers that a change was brought about, whereby the men who were really fitted for positions of trust were placed in command instead of the men, who by reason of birth or heredity were filling offices, the duties of which they were entirely ignorant.

The central figure among the men of the character of the Right Honorable Sir Joseph Porter, K. C. B., first lord of Admiralty, who, knowing nothing whatever about the affairs of the navy, thought to strengthen his position among the officers by marrying the daughter of a captain in the navy, but on discovering that by some strange mistake Josephine was the daughter of a common sailor, she ceased to have any attraction for him, and was permitted to marry the man of her choice.

In the production to be given in the Eugene theatre on Monday and Tuesday evenings of next week for the benefit of the Y. M. C. A. the management has secured to fill the role of Sir Joseph, Mr. D. S. Lamm, recently from California. Mr. Lamm has a baritone voice of remarkably pleasing quality and his interpretation of the character is equal to many professionals. Some of the most pleasing features of any opera are the male choruses and in this "Pinafore" excels most of the light operas, as nearly half of the first act is performed by the men.

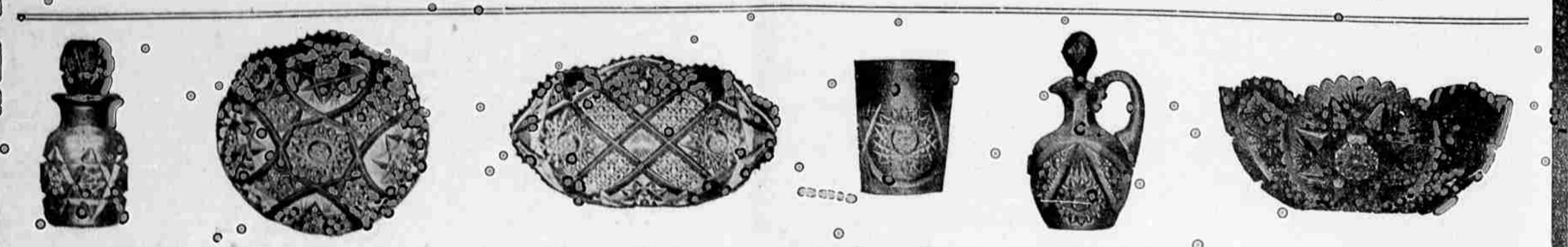
