NEW FEATURE WILL BE FRESHMAN GAME

Planned to Make It Annual Affair Between U. of O. and Corvallis

A new feature of the Oregon football schedule this year will be the freshman game to be played with Corvallis in Eugene on the first Saturday in November. The game played between the first year classes of the rival schools of the east has become second only in interest to the big game itself. If this year's contest is made a success, this will be a permanent event. Although there are not quite enough freshmen turning out for the daily practice to satisfy the desire of Coach Warner, Oregon's first year men should be able to put up a fairly good aggregation to meet the farmer huskies. There are good men for the line and there is a fast backfield. A possible and incomplete line-up would be the following: Crawford, center; Groat and Hall, tackles; Terpening and Bradshaw, guards; Fisher, end; Jones and Cobb, halves, and Bean, full. This leaves one end and a quarter to fill. Besides this, the fact that any freshman who makes the varsity team is barred, and this may take away several of these.

Good Class This Year

The freshman class this year has come under the general approval of the whole school, both the faculty and the students. They seem to be willing to take part in student activities and all realize that because of the elimination of hazing that they must show their respect to the upper classmen. The class numbers over 250 and already this number is well divided among the various activities. Trainer Bill Hayward is pleased with the youngsters and at the student body meeting announced that he had 35 freshmen in training for the track season and that he expected the whole 35 to stay with him. At this meeting they were passed other commitments from other department heads. All the boys are wearing the green caps, apparently without exception, and no compulsion has been necessary. There are fifteen of their number trying for football places.

There is being planned by committees from the sophomore and freshman classes, with President Campbell, a class rush that will take place of the obsolete hazing, the same that is prevalent in all Eastern colleges. Although nothing definite has been decided it is understood that the flag rush is to be considered. Those who have hoped for something to "happen" will not be disappointed.

BASEBALL GROUNDS WILL HOLD THIRTY THOUSAND FANS

Philadelphia, Oct. 6.—A meeting to determine the arrangements necessary for playing the world's baseball championship games, scheduled for this city between the Chicago and the Philadelphia championship clubs was held today by John Heydler, secretary of the National league, Robert McRay, of the American league and several officials of the Philadelphia American league club.

While no official announcement has been made, it is understood that all 25-cent bleacher seats will be sold to the public at \$1.00 a seat, and that temporary seats, which will be erected on the outfield, will be disposed of at 50 cents each. The 50-cent grandstand seats, it is said, will be \$2 and \$3 each, according to the location.

The park, with the temporary accommodations, will seat about 30,000.

Players Get Money
As usual the players will receive 60 per cent of the proceeds of the first four games, but to allow the players to partake of the benefit of a possible Sunday game, the commission put provision in the rules that if none of the first four games receipts equal those of the Sunday game in Chicago, in case the latter game is played, the players' proportionate share shall be made on the basis of the Sunday game in Chicago.

Tokio, Oct. 6.—Before a crowd of 50,000, and with American Ambassador Thomas J. O'Brien and Mrs. O'Brien as guests of honor, the University of Chicago baseball team again defeated Kelo University today in one of the best games ever played in Japan.

The score was 3 to 2, and in the last inning Kelo, who batted last, came within an ace of crowding over the tying run.
