TRAINING TABLE ESTABLISHED FOR FOOTBALL TEAM Only Seven Men Will Have Flesh-Building Diet at Present Time

Training table was begun today when seven men were assembled around the designated table in the boys' dormitory at the University with Coach Warner and his three assistants, Hunt, Moores and Pinkham, besides Bill Hayward, scattered among the small squad that will start on the special diet. There are only seven players on the training table to begin with. These are Main, Taylor, Latourette, Johnson, Michael, Grout and Kellogg. These are the men who need weight more than others and the diet will be suited to flesh building. The training table is maintained at the players' own expense and only the ones who are considered to need the special care in eating are allowed to sit down three times a day with the coaches.

The first game of the season is only two days away and all members of the team are fighting for a chance to play. It is quite probable, however, that all the men will be given a chance in this game, as far as possible.

The annual team this year will consist of the greatest aggregation of players in the Northwest, composed, as it will be, of stars of the Oregon teams for the past five or more years. More all-Northwest players will be assembled than ever before.

It is interesting to consider what the outcome of the game will be, for although the grads will have had no practice, the probabilities are that the Oregon team will meet defeat, for the old players are all in pretty good shape. Gordon Moores has been coaching the Oregon team and is in the prime of condition. Coleman has been playing baseball all summer and is in good form. Hickson will depend upon his old knowledge of the game. Two of these three will form the ends. Playing tackle will be Pinkham, who also has been coaching the Oregon men. Fred Moulton, who will be able to use his old punting toe again, and Earle "Bull" Penland, the famous guard of the old days, will be back in his place. "Pen" has been climbing the mountains as a government surveyor for several years and will be as hard as iron. MacIntyre will be the other guard. George Hug, who has been training his Eugene High school team, is in good form to hold his old position at center.

At quarter in the game will be matched brother against brother, when young Latourette, who is to be the star of the back field with Taylor this year, will have a chance at his famous older brother, Jack, who has been training with the Multnomah club team and will know the game for merrymaking point. In the back line there is another sad feature. Templetton must go into the game almost on the eve of his marriage. But the back line will be one of the greatest ever run on Kincaid field, and on either side of him will be Sullivan and Walker, both of whom will be in splendid form.

As a preliminary game on this day there will be a well matched game between the Eugene High school and the University freshmen.
