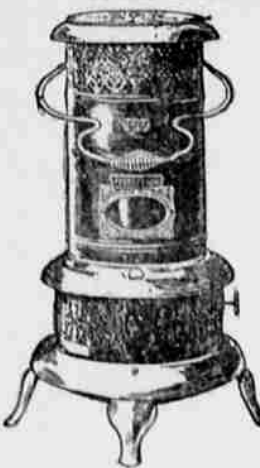

SEVENTY ACRES TO BE PLANTED TO APPLES

President Simmons, of Willamette Land Co., Here—Will

Order Trees at Once

C. B. Simmons, president of the Willamette Land Company, which owns a large tract of land a few miles northeast of Eugene, and which has been on the market for the past year or two with good success, was here over Sunday and spent some time on the company's tract hunting China pheasants. While here he announced that the company will at once order apple trees to plant on 70 acres of the tract this winter. The best varieties that flourish in this section of the state will be ordered.

This land is said to be among the best tracts in the whole state for apple raising. The tract already has a few small orchards and better apples were never seen than those raised there. Manager Lyon, of the local office of the company, this afternoon said that an expert fruit and soil man will have charge of the planting of the trees and their care until they begin to bear fruit.
