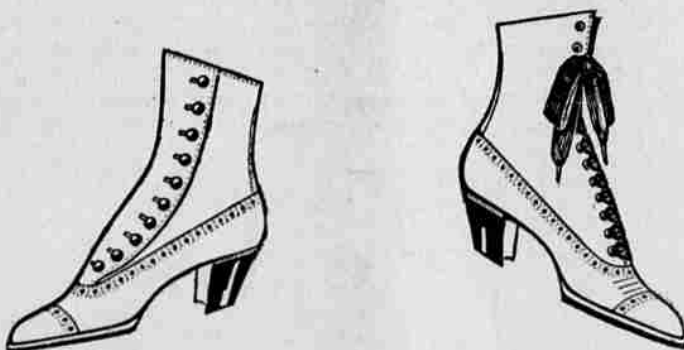

SPRINGFIELD

DRUNKEN MAN ON RAILROAD TRACK

Springfield, Nov. 29.—The train crew of the Wendling local picked up a man near the Natron junction yesterday afternoon bearing the name of William Hays, who was in a forlorn condition. The man was drunk and had walked from Natron. He had taken the wrong track and was headed for Wendling. Before he had proceeded for, however, his load of "soft drink" bore too heavily upon him and he sought a soft resting place beside the track in a muddy puddle where he wallowed until he had carefully arranged a sleeping place. The train crew of the train saw him there and brought him into the city. He was searched by Marshal Halverson and found to have on his person a sum total of one cent. When he had sufficiently recovered, however, he declared that he had a valuable gold watch and \$25 when he left Natron, and that he had been robbed.

BIG BRIDGE HAS FIRST BAPTISM OF WATER

Springfield, Nov. 29.—The new P. E. & E. bridge has withstood its first high water with satisfaction. During the freshet of yesterday many wondered if the new bridge would be affected, but the great structure held firmly and nothing gave way. The water did no damage whatever in Springfield other than to shut off traffic with Eugene on the wagon road for the day. The water came over the wagon road at the Walker hop yard shortly before noon, and as the crest of the flood was reached the road was covered to a depth of two feet. A number of daring drivers, however, did attempt to ford the torrent, but it was a risky trick, for the road is narrow and the current swift. At times drift wood would collect against the piers of the bridges but only in small quantities. A number of skiffs along the river were taken out by the sudden rise of the water, but little other damage was done here. There is considerable water standing in various parts of the city that are low and in the streets, as a result of the heavy rain.

MILL NOW RUNNING ON EIGHT-HOUR SHIFT

Springfield, Nov. 29.—Many a Springfield housewife was startled last night when she heard the mill whistle and supper was just started. How could the time have gone so quickly? But upon looking at the clock, it was only five o'clock. Eight hours is the shift of the Springfield mill for the rest of the winter. The mill man now works the same time as the book-keeper, the plumber or the printer, or any other of his fellow wage-earners. Owing to a shortage in the log supply, and other reasons, the Booth-Kelly company have found it more satisfactory to run on a short shift and burn less electricity during the winter nights.

COMMERCIAL CLUB WILL ELECT OFFICERS

Springfield, Nov. 29.—The Springfield Commercial club will hold an election of officers at the regular meeting next Friday night. At this meeting numerous plans of civic improvement and boosting work will be discussed, and this meeting is to be considered the word "go" for a greater Springfield.
