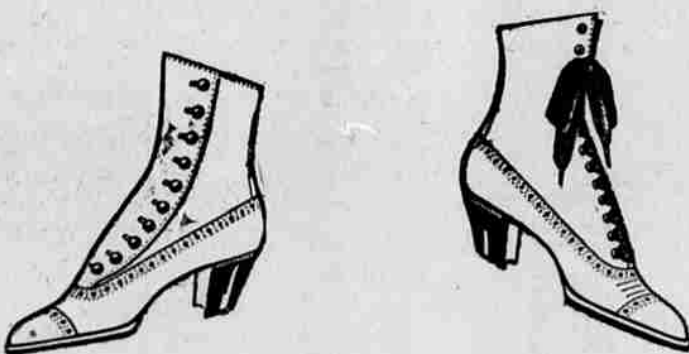

600,000 ROSES PLUCKED FROM U. CAMPUS

Head Gardener Makes That Estimate for This Year—600 Plants

That 600,000 roses have been cut from the gardens of the University campus during the past season is the opinion of the head gardener, Henry M. Fisher, who has carefully watched the growth of the long banks of bushes that border the principal walks and drives. The plants were cut down yesterday, and they have bloomed continuously since April, or for eight months. There are over 600 plants, and the gardener and his assistants declare that each plant has easily produced 1000 blossoms each. During the summer full blossoms were picked daily and over two wheelbarrow loads were carried away each day. On many of the plants at one time could be counted 50 and 100 buds each. There are four principal varieties—the La France, the Frau Karl Druschke, the Caroline Testout and the Franz Degeant. These are set out in separate hedges and have given the campus a beautiful appearance and dainty fragrance for just two-thirds of the year. The roses are the special pride of the head gardener, and the plants have been made to produce blossoms that will rival the finest greenhouse plants. The campus has supplied the needs of many a Eugene social function, and have been given gratis and in almost any quantities.

Never in the history of the state University has the campus had the appearance that the past summer and fall have seen. The acres of velvety green grass have been daily cut and trimmed and the well-rounded walks and drives have been cut out with a sharp outline. Although not all of the campus is in lawn, the uncared for area which is at the foot of the crest on which the buildings are located is being made smaller each year and is kept neat. With the purchase of a power grass cutter, probably this winter, the whole campus may be put into one great velvety lawn.

WILL NOT BUILD FROM MEDFORD TO PACIFIC OCEAN

An absolute and unqualified denial of the report published in a southern Oregon paper to the effect that the Hill interests contemplate building a line of railway from Klamath Falls through Medford and Jacksonville to Crescent City, a port in northern California, is made by E. P. Shannon, assistant to John F. Stevens, president of the Spokane, Portland and Seattle, and head of the Hill lines in Oregon.

The report referred to stated that the portions of the Pacific & Eastern already constructed would be used as a part of the line, and that the Pacific & Eastern survey from Klamath Falls to a pass 22 miles south of Crater Lake would be utilized. The Pacific & Eastern is now a Hill line, having been purchased from John R. Allen. The fact that G. A. Kyle, formerly a prominent Hill official, is consulting engineer for a mile of new road being built by the Rogue River Valley Railroad company up Jackson creek is taken as an indication that that road is also to become a part of the supposedly proposed new line.

"There had been some talk of such a line being built," said Mr. Shannon, "but the plan has been definitely abandoned. We would not be likely to use Mr. Kyle, one of our former officials, if we intended to build such a line and wished to shroud our movements in mystery, as is supposed. John R. Allen is not connected with the Hill interests. He bought the Pacific & Eastern and we purchased it from him. That is as far as the connection goes."—Oregonian.
