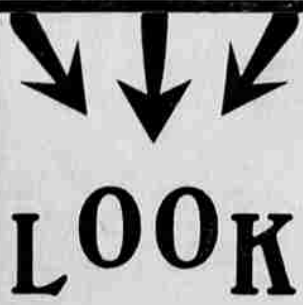

**TALE OF EXTREME
CRUELTY TOLD IN
DIVORCE COMPLAINT****Mrs. Mary Luebke Says Husband Wouldn't Speak to Her For Weeks**

If the story as told by Mrs. Mary Luebke in her divorce complaint is true, there will be no hesitancy on the part of the circuit judge in granting her divorce from her husband, Fred G. Luebke. The complaint which was filed late yesterday afternoon by her attorney, L. M. Travis, states that they were married in Eugene on May 12, 1910; that the defendant at the time they were married was the owner of 80 acres of land three miles west of Cottage Grove, valued at \$3,000, and which, for the purpose of preventing the marital rights of the plaintiff from attaching thereto, he deeded to Gustave Luebke. She says that for weeks at a time during their married life, her husband refused to say a word to her, although they lived alone, and she was very lonesome; that she loaned him \$208, which she had saved from her own earnings before they were married, he promising to secure the sum by giving a note and mortgage, but he never did, and when she asked him to keep his promise in the matter, he struck her and knocked her down.

She asks for a divorce, for the restoration of her maiden name, Mary Falter, that she be declared a part owner of the 80 acres of land, and for \$100 suit money.
