### M. L. BOWMAN

Mr. Bowman has interpreted all the premier roles of grand opera in nearly every city in America, and enjoys the distinguished honor of being accounted America's greatest basso-cantante. His qualification will no doubt enable him to maintain that proud position for this generation. His complete mastery of his art enables him to reach the lower notes of the scale, retaining the velvety richness of the bass. The charm of his song is greatly enhanced by the purity of a perfect pronunciation of the words of his text, without marring the harmony of the tonal poem. His mastery of acoustic is marvelous, and was achieved by years of study and experience. ### PAULINE MILLER-CHAPMAN

Pauline Miller Chapman has won her splendid international success and recognition as an artist of unusual merit through years of unflinching devotion to the finest forms of vocal art. She is a graduate of the Chicago Conservatory of Music, and subsequent years of instruction in the schools of Italy and Germany, finally finishing her tuition under the famous Lamperti, who is recognized by the world as the greatest master of vocal instruction. She immediately sprang into prominence in the cities of Germany and in London, and upon returning to America became soloist for Isterman and Theodore Thomas' orchestras. Her voice is of wide range, of intense dramatic timbre, and her perfect control permits daring feats of vocal enchantment that ever capture and enthrall her audiences.

### WM. R. BOONE

Mr. William R. Boone, pianist, was for many years the idol of Newport's aesthetic circles. As organist of Trinity chapel, and later Zabriskie Memorial chapel, he soon won a lasting place in the affections of Eastern music lovers. The social circles of Boston and New York made constant demand upon his services, and in company with the Russian danseuses, Baron Hildi von Rothandahl, appeared in all famous salons of New York, Boston and other Eastern cities. His work on either the piano or organ is full of dash, brilliancy and artistic technique which has been acquired by few masters of these instruments. He blends the tonal power of the instruments with a peculiar art and rare skill of the accomplished masters. His production of the singing tones on the piano are the wonder and delight of his auditors.

### ORDERS WILL BE MORE EXPENSIVE

New Regulations Raise Cost, Which Will Increase Receipts in Eugene Office

The receipts of the Eugene postoffice during this year will materially increase in the money order department, owing to an order recently issued by the postmaster general, raising the rates on foreign money orders, of which a great number are despatched from the local office by laborers on the Natron extension and on the gas construction crews.

A copy of the new regulation just received here shows that an increase of from 50 to 100 per cent has been made in the money order rate. It applies to all foreign countries, two classes being listed, which have slightly varying rates for small amounts.

For a long time the charge for money orders to foreign countries was \$1 a hundred, with a graduated scale for smaller amounts. About two years ago a cut was made in this rate to something like 50 per cent of the old figure. Now a raise has been made which restores the charge to something like its old figure, with even an increase over that in certain cases. The new regulation is to go into effect after February 1.
