GOVERNOR FAVORS WHIPPING POST

Vetoes Bill to Abolish It, and Says Its Victims Are Barbarians Statehouse, Salem, Or., Feb. 11.—Denouncing the wife-beater as at heart a barbarian, and as such deserving of the only kind of treatment which will appeal to a person of brutish impulses, Governor West this afternoon sent to the house his veto of H. B. 101, by Buchanan, abolishing the whipping post.

The people of Upper North Fork are forming a stock company to build a telephone line from Minerva to either Florence or Acme. The line from the upper part of that stream is to be extended down to Minerva and there connected with the line down the river. We understand that arrangements have been made with Austin & Stanwood to exchange messages over their line.

Last week W. F. Potter sold his ranch to Frank Sander. The place consists of 240 acres fronting on the Siuslaw river at the head of tidewater a short distance above the town of Mapleton. All the stock including a team of horses and several cows, household furniture and a gasoline launch went with the place at six thousand dollars. Mr. Potter and family left Saturday for Silver City, New Mexico, where they expect to make their home. They will spend a few days with relatives at Elmira.

Ernest Hewitt, of Acme, took a dip in the river Saturday which cost him a gun and several other articles. He was stepping from one floating wharf to another when a plank overturned and let him into the water. A shot gun, box of cartridges, shovel and a bucket he was carrying likewise fell in and were lost. Ernest hung to the gun till he went to the bottom of the river and came up once then let it go.

A few days ago F. H. Alexander received a letter from his son Roy, who has been working in a mill at Hume, California, stating that he had injured his back by a fall and was then in a hospital. The physician thought he would be laid up for several weeks. The accident occurred January 20, and Roy was sitting propped up in bed when he wrote the letter.

Inasmuch as there are few barbarians left in Oregon, according to statistics of crime in his possession, reads the veto in effect, the governor says he believes that the "relic of barbarism known as the whipping post," should remain on the statute books until the last male person exhibiting the hereditary instincts of the cave-man shall have been eliminated from the state.

The whipping post law was enacted by the legislature in 1905. Ineffectual attempts to abolish it were made by Representative Buchanan in 1907 and in 1909. He renewed his efforts early this session, and his bill passed the house and the senate and went to the governor February 8th.

Those opposed to the whipping post law urge that it is a survival of the statutes in force in the days when people were not so civilized nor so enlightened as they are now, said Governor West in commenting on his veto message. "but I have noticed one thing—fine or imprison a man for beating his wife and he will come back for another sentence; but apply the lash to his back with both the physical torture and mental anguish and chagrin such a penalty carries with it, and he never comes back."
