## PACIFIC ISLANDS WILL GO FIRST

Washington, D. C., March 21.—That Japan could easily take possession of the Pacific islands, under the existing conditions was the opinion of Gen. Miles, U. S. A., retired. Discussing Count von Rosen's article given to the press Gen. Miles declared he believed there would be no war with Japan. "But," he added, "you never can tell. There is no earthly reason why Japan should go to war with America. However, if they should clash, the Pacific islands would quickly succumb to the attack. In three or four weeks the United States could put 5,000,000 men, properly equipped and well officered, into the field. This is sufficient argument that Japanese aggression beyond the islands would not be effective."

The club has gotten out a large amount of literature relative to Junction and Lane county, and has been instrumental in bringing \$100,000 into the community. Through its advertising this season, this has been the club's most prosperous year, and all but a few of the merchants have responded nobly to the cause. The only regret is that all will reap a benefit whether they have done their part or not. But the claims are in every town.

### Concrete Gangs at Work

Two concrete gangs are taking advantage of the weather conditions and putting in concrete walks. Dr. N. L. Lee has about finished two blocks around his premises, Mr. Linder has just had finished the walk in front of his residence, and a number of others will soon be finished.

### Cleanup Day, March 22

Wednesday, March 22, has been designated as cleanup day. Hand bills have been delivered to each residence, asking each one to clean up their premises. The merchants will be asked to close their stores for a half day and clean up around their places of business.

### New Concrete Plant

The O'Meara Concrete Co. are at work on their patent concrete block plant, and they have a number of sample blocks out of the forms and on exhibition. When Chas. O'Meara, the manager, returns from Frisco, work will begin on a larger scale, when it is claimed a block can be made every minute.

### Paving Specifications

The council has received specifications for paving from the civil engineer and the propositions that have been submitted will be taken up as soon as some legal matters can be adjusted satisfactorily.

The public and high schools are planning on a big entertainment to be given March 31st for the benefit of the school library.

The city council has ordered a walk built on Elm street north to the city limits to accommodate fifty or more families living in Copenhagen, the Danish settlement north of the city.

### Building Improvements

Mr. Kapping has moved his residence out toward the street and will make some extensive repairs and improvements on the property.

Mrs. J. Gilstrap has about finished the carpenter work on their new home and will soon have a modern home.

Dr. Ruff has his new home under cover, and with the fruit he has planted, will in a few years own a beautiful orchard home.

The Ladies' Improvement club has the seed already to sow in the dopt park and the granite on the ground ready for the walks when they are surveyed off. The band stand and benches will be painted and a beautiful place made ready for the summer.

## NOTICE OF GENERAL CITY ELECTION

5. Shall the common council be authorized to issue and sell \$25,000.00 bonds for the purpose of installing a series tungsten electrical lighting system?
6. Shall ordinance No. 1964 appointing a charter commission be approved?
7. Shall the council issue and sell \$25,000.00 2 per cent sewer bonds for the purpose of constructing two main sewers, one through Fairmount and the other on Tyler street?
