RUSSIAN MINISTER MURDERED IN CITY OF PEKIN, SAYS RUMOR

St. Petersburg, March 20.—It is rumored that M. Korostovetz, Russian minister to China, has been murdered in Peking. Neither the foreign office nor the war office is able to confirm the report.

Advices were received for the Associated Press direct from Peking late this afternoon and mentioned in the Russian legation in connection with the Russo-Chinese negotiations, but made no reference to the untoward event which might have furnished the basis for the rumors at St. Petersburg that the Russian minister had been assassinated.

RAILWAY LINE PAYS THE LARGEST TAX

One-tenth of Property in Benton County Is Owned by Southern Pacific

Corvallis, Or., March 21.—Tax returns from Benton county show that the Southern Pacific owns and controls more than one-tenth of the taxable property in the county and that the company's assessment has increased from \$10,850.32 last year, to \$23,698.33 for the year ending April 4, 1911. This increase is the direct result of the change in assessment of timber land, of which the railroad company owns 11,000 acres in this part of the valley. Instead of assessing the timber and land as one they have been assessed separately. The total tax of the county is \$193,705.05, of which \$59,105 remains to be collected. The Southern Pacific company is the largest taxpayer in the county.

OREGON PYTHIANS HAVE BEST YEAR IN HISTORY.

Nearly 600 New Members Added—Grand Chancellor Made Many Visits

About 600 new members have been received into the order of Knights of Pythias in Oregon this year, according to statistics compiled by Willard Marks, of Albany, chairman of the publicity committee of the grand lodge. When the grand lodge convenes in its next annual session at Astoria in June the preceding fiscal year will show the greatest growth of any single year since the order was established in this state.

When D. E. Yoran, of Eugene, became grand chancellor of the order in Oregon last June he took the new slogan of his term, "6,750 members in Oregon by next June," and practically enough members have been secured already to reach the goal Chancellor Yoran set. Lodges throughout the state continue to grow rapidly so the mark at which the grand chancellor aimed will not only be reached but passed.

Aside from increase in membership, it has been an active year among the lodges of this order in Oregon. District conventions have been held in almost all of the districts in the state and there have been many special meetings of various kinds. Those districts which have not yet held conventions will probably hold them soon and it is very probable that before the next grand lodge session every district in the state will have held a convention this year.

The 47th anniversary of the foundation of the order, which occurred on February 19 last, was generally observed by the lodges with special meetings and it is estimated that more than 50 different lodges held special anniversary ceremonies.

During his term as grand vice-chancellor last year and as grand chancellor this year, D. E. Yoran has visited every single lodge of the order within the boundaries of this state, thus establishing a splendid record. The lodges which were not visited by Mr. Yoran this year received official visits from Grand Vice-Chancellor Frank T. Wrightman, of Salem. Lou R. Stinson, of Salem, the popular grand keeper of records and seal, who has filled that position most successfully for many years, has accompanied the two leading grand officers on many of their visits. L. M. Curl, of Albany, is a past grand chancellor of the order in this state and one of Oregon's two representatives to the supreme lodge of the United States, has also assisted in the Pythian activity of the year by attending many of the district conventions and Pythian gatherings.

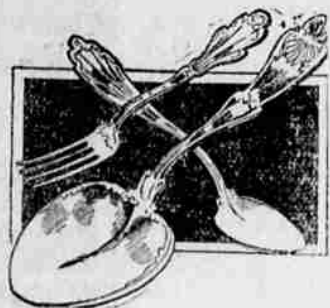
