BOUNDARY EXTENSION
Notice is hereby given that pursuant to ordinance No. 1093, duly passed by the common council of the city of Eugene on the 13th day of March, 1911, a special city election will be held in said city, and in the territory hereinafter described, on the first day of May, 1911, from 8 o'clock a. m. until 7 o'clock p. m., to determine the question as to whether said hereinafter described territory shall be annexed to and become a part of said city of Eugene, to-wit:
