Manager Barbour reports that all the men are in the prime of condition and their week's vacation and training received there has been a benefit. The first of the week's sightseeing trips were given and the team "saw" Prisco. At Berkeley they have been quartered at the fraternity houses and report at the best of treatment.

California is generally conceded the strongest team on the coast, and the big fight for supremacy will be between Oregon and Washington. The University of Washington team arrived Wednesday and established

their rival camp near Oregon. One of Oregon's expected first places was lost Saturday when a California man threw the hammer 157 feet 3 inches. Bailey's best has been 149 feet. Nell is expected first place in the javelin by all, insuring one first place for Oregon. Oregon is strong in the hurdles and the distances.
