Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Montana are included in the organization and the coming meeting will be a gathering representing the musical talent of the four states. A banquet will be held the first evening and will be marked by addresses and toasts by prominent musicians. The second and third evenings will be devoted to concerts. Morning sessions will be given up to educational conferences, embracing vocal, instrumental, theory and public school music. Well informed people on musical subjects will present papers along these various lines and a discussion will follow each paper. Afternoon sessions will be varied with recitals. Mrs. Rose Hanscom and Mrs. Rose Bloch Bauer will be among the soloists, and W. H. Boyer will give one evening to choral work. The convention, coming as it does during rose carnival week, will give those in attendance an opportunity to enjoy this great floral fête. The sessions and concerts will be held at hours not conflicting with the principal events of the carnival, and those attending the convention can avail themselves of carnival excursion rates.

PRESIDENT TAFT TO ADDRESS DOCTORS OF PHILADELPHIA

Philadelphia, April 20.—Physicians of the Quaker city are preparing today to give a rousing reception to President Taft, who has accepted an invitation to address the Philadelphia Medical club at its annual banquet tomorrow. It is hoped that the president will announce his views on the proposed national department of public health, which is now being advocated by physicians and which will have a cabinet official at its head.

In accepting the invitation, President Taft highly praised the doctors of America. "It nothing else justified the Spanish-American war," he said, "the discoveries of the American physicians in investigating tropical diseases and the necessity for better sanitary measures in the countries to the South were ample to justify the expense of the war ten times over."

"It remained for the medical men of this country, and especially the physicians in the United States army, to discover more things in the period since the war than were discovered in the entire two centuries before that time; and England, Germany, France and Holland have been engaged in the colonial business in the tropics for from one to two hundred years."
