PUBLIC PLAYGROUND ASSOCIATION HAS BEEN ORGANIZED

Citizens Band Themselves Together for Supervision of Children's Sports

We, the undersigned citizens of Eugene, appreciating the benefits of healthful, wholesome and morally educative play, for the children of our city during the long summer vacation, and realizing the need of adequate supervision of children's sports in order to render them truly beneficial, hereby band ourselves together, under the name of the Playground Association of Eugene for the purpose of securing the proper organization and supervision of play for the children of Eugene, above the age of four years, during the ensuing summer from school closing to school opening.

We hereby mutually agree to contribute each the sum of one dollar toward that object, and in order to secure general interest in the movement and adequate support for it, we authorize the president and secretary of this association to issue in the name of the Playground Association of Eugene certificates of membership to other citizens, on the payment of a like sum each, until the association shall have a membership of not less than 500.

We pledge ourselves to employ all funds accruing from such additional membership to the furtherance of the object above stated; to accord to each full membership rights in every general meeting of the association, to be notified by the president; and as executive committee of the association, to present to each member on or before December 1, 1911, a full and detailed statement of receipts and disbursements.

This first organization shall be continued throughout the season. All members signing below as charter members, shall constitute the executive committee.

SOME OF OREGON'S NEW STATUTES

The following new laws passed by the last legislature went into effect May 20th:

Prohibiting the protection of Dolly Varden trout.
The port of Portland bill, with commission for government of cities of 100,000 or more.
Prohibiting combinations of trusts, by insurance or other companies.
Requiring the marking of skins of wild animals when bounties are paid.
Providing for two chaplains for the penitentiary.
Providing for the licensing of insurance agents and providing overhead writing.
Defining the duties of road supervisors.
Providing penalty for not reporting marriage to the county clerk within a month by person performing the ceremony.
Requiring the registration of stallions.
Creating the office of state immigration agent with \$20,000 appropriation.
Creating the office of state immigration agent, with \$20,000 appropriation.
Providing for a commission for revising the laws of Oregon.
Requiring an annual license for claimants for water rights.
Providing for special elections for annexing territory to a city.
Requiring an oath upon registration that voter is in good faith a member of the political party designated.
Creating a wild game refuge.
State printer's flat salary bill.
Protecting Chinese pheasants until October 15, 1913.
For publication of delinquent taxes.
The public utility law, to be referred.
Making three congressional districts.
Providing for the naming of the farms of the state.
Abolishing firecrackers over 2 1-2 inches long.
Making October 12 Columbus Day.
Prohibiting the sale of liquor within six miles of any public institution except in the case of incorporated towns.
Requiring decisions by judges within three months.
State training school for reform.
Providing for joint high schools by vote.
