GOVERNOR WEST BRINGS CONVICT TO PRISON

Hall Found Asleep Under Tree
Where Posse Found Him

Yesterday

Corvallis, Or., June 22.—Lester Hall, the escaped convict from the Oregon penitentiary, was captured last night without the firing of a single shot, by a posse led by Governor West, in a clump of woods just off the road near the little village of Blodgett, a station on the Corvallis & Eastern railroad, 23 miles from Corvallis.

Hall did not even attempt any resistance, but only smiled when the governor awakened him by placing his hand on his shoulder and shaking him, and he looked into the muzzles of the guns held on him by other members of the posse.

Hall's face was bleeding from wounds received early yesterday when Sheriff Gallahue fired at him once as he was running along a county road. He had had no sleep for 60 hours and for much of that time had been without food. He was in a sorry state of exhaustion and seemed almost to welcome his capture by the posse.

Sheriff Wounds Him.

The sheriff shot Hall five miles east of Peak, yesterday at 4:25 o'clock in the morning. The sheriff was lying in wait for Hall, whom he expected to come that way, when he sighted the convict walking down the road, revolver in hand. The sheriff called to him to halt. Instead of doing so, Hall started to run directly toward him, and then as he caught sight of the sheriff with a double-barreled shotgun aimed at his breast, suddenly swerved into the brush at the side of the road. As he did so, the sheriff fired, the charge of shot striking Hall in the face and breast. He staggered for an instant and almost fell.

The shell of the second barrel jammed in the sheriff's gun, and before the officer could fire again Hall had regained his feet and disappeared in the thicket.

From there the posse took up his trail and followed him closely all day, but despite his wounds the fleeing convict kept as well in the lead that they did not catch up to him until late in the evening, when the fugitive, utterly exhausted, dropped and fell asleep.

Visit to Mother Forbidden.

Although Hall was so tired that he could hardly move without assistance, he assumed an attitude that was almost jaunty in replying to several questions asked him by the governor.

"I wanted to see my mother," he said, when the governor asked him why he had broken his parole and run away. Hall's mother lives at Waldport, and it was toward that place that his trail had led since he began his wild dash from confinement at Mall Gardner Huber's house, with the kidnapped mail carrier compelled to drive him.

Hall said further that he had been mistreated at the penitentiary.

"Why didn't you come to me for redress?" asked the governor.

"I hated the idea of having to stay there for 20 years," said Hall.

"Besides I wanted to see my mother."

WOLGAST AND WALSH WILL FIGHT NEXT FALL

San Francisco, June 22.—Following their action in depositing forfeits of \$1,000 each, to bind a match between Ad Wolgast and Freddie Walsh some time next September, Tom Jones and Baron Long, respectively, managers of the two lightweight pugilists, have signed articles tending toward the prospective match.

The signed agreement stipulates that the contest must be 20 rounds or more, to take place at a location later to be agreed upon, but to be held during the month of September. Ringside weight of 133 pounds is called for.

Each principal must deposit \$9,000 in addition to the forfeit already posted, which will go as a side wager and shall be turned over to the stakeholder 30 days prior to the match.

TY COBB MAY STAR IN "THE COLLEGE WIDOW."

Detroit, June 22.—Ty Cobb, centerfielder of the Detroit American League baseball club, declared today that he was seriously considering an

offer to go on the stage next winter in a revised version of "The College Widow." Several prominent theatrical men and Outfielder Jimmy Callahan, of the Chicago White Sox, are said to be interested in the venture.

Instead of the "Widow" being the heroine, the play will be revised, it is said, to place a champion batsman in the leading role and a baseball instead of a football game will figure in the plot.
