VOTE NEXT FALL ON EUGENE'S NEW CHARTER

Proposed Document Drafted Now in Hands of Members of Board

The citizens of Eugene probably will be given a chance to vote on the proposed commission form of government in September, according to statements given out by members of the charter commission which has been at work since April in drafting a charter for Eugene to embody the commission government idea.

Complete drafts of the amended charter have been supplied to each of the 15 members of the commission, and each member is going over the draft carefully to see that the parts of the new charter are consistent with each other and with the sections of the old charter which are to be left intact.

An effort will be made to have the completed and approved document ready for submission to the city council at its regular meeting on July 10. If it is approved by the council, a special election for its submission can be called for not less than 60 days after that date, which will be about September 10.

At the regular city election last Spring the people voted the appointment of a charter commission of 15 members, who should draft a commission charter to be submitted to the people. The commission has held weekly meetings since that time. The document, which will be submitted to the council at its next meeting, is the result of their work.

production to some extent, but the height of the producing season never the less is past, and from this time on the butter output will steadily grow smaller. The Eastern and Northern markets are developing strength and the local market necessarily is affected.

An advance in quotations on condensed milk also is counted a certainty of the near future, and for the reasons governing the butter market. Some of the Coast condenseurs have expressed the belief that conditions now warrant a lift of 15 cents a case on condensed milk.

Cannot Pick Strawberries. The rains have interfered with the shipments of strawberries to the front street trade, and receipts this morning were limited. Sales were made from \$1.50 to \$1.75 a crate, according to quality.

According to growers, there will be only a nominal amount of this fruit to offer in the immediate future. Demand for home canning is about over owing to absence of the canning varieties from the market. Regular canneries are still putting up all offerings, and are still paying various quotations.

A few small shipments of local berries and raspberries are coming forward, but the volume is too small to fully test quotations.

New Potatoes Easier. With increasing supplies of new potatoes, the local market is easier. While some are still asking as high as 4c a pound, supplies in plenty are obtainable at 3½c. This is generally for the California product. Local new potatoes are again showing an increase in offerings, with quality and size better.

STUDENTS FROM FAR AND WIDE ARE HERE

22 Counties in Oregon and Six States are Represented at Summer School

Twenty counties in Oregon and six states are represented by the students attending the University of Oregon summer school, some of whom have come 2000 miles. Two students from Missouri, two from Texas, one from Illinois, one from California, and six from Washington. The Texas students are girls who are taking a six weeks' vacation in Oregon for their health, while those from Illinois are school teachers who are taking their vacation in the west. Among the Oregon students, 22 are from Multnomah county, 33 from Lane, nine from Marion and Clackamas, and six from Douglas. The majority of the summer school students are teachers.

A feature of the work is an assembly course in which a lecture is given daily by some prominent speaker or member of the faculty. Tuesday L. H. Wier, LL. D., secretary of the American Playground association, spoke. Wednesday President P. L. Campbell of the University addressed the students, and yesterday Professor Joseph Schafer spoke on "Leadership" in which he characterized Hill and Harriman as leaders in the sense of manipulation and working for selfish motives, while Washington and Lincoln are the type of American leaders who have a real conviction and who seek to carry it out for the benefit of the nation. Today Professor E. E. DeCoe gave the first of a series of two lectures upon Canada in which he dealt with the industrial, geographical and educational phases of Canadian life.

The public is invited to attend these lectures, which are free.

LAWYER SHOT DOWN IN CANYON CITY

Baker, Or., June 28.—George Barnes, a pioneer attorney of Canyon City, aged 60 years, was shot and instantly killed on the streets of that town yesterday by George Anderson, a resident of that place and a former rival for the hand of Mrs. Barnes. Anderson is in the Grant county jail, charged with murder. When the present Mrs. Barnes was Mrs. Alexander Bowsman, Anderson, while a suitor for her hand, brought suit against her husband's estate. Barnes defended the suit and defeated Anderson in court, and at the same time pressed his suit for the widow's hand and won the prize. Anderson is reported to have said that he would kill Barnes for this, and yesterday when Barnes appeared on the street he met Anderson, who emptied a heavy automatic pistol into Barnes' body, killing him instantly.

Barnes was a leading attorney of that section of the state. He was the first attorney to locate in Prineville, and later removed to Canyon City. He was wealthy, and a man of high standing. He held membership in the Elks' lodge of The Dalles, and has relatives in Portland. Anderson is also wealthy, having large property interests in the John Day valley.

GOVERNOR APPOINTS ROAD COMMITTEE

Salem, Or., June 28.—To avoid duplication of good roads bills to go before the people through the initiative or by way of the legislature, as well as to avoid confusion in preparing such bills, Governor West today named a committee with one representative from each county except Multnomah, which has a representative of five. On this committee is also named the State Grange good roads committee which includes C. E. Spence, of Clackamas county; A. L. Mason, of Hood River and A. L. Shaw of Linn.

Governor West says that from reports he has received a bewildering array of road laws at the next general election by various organizations.

He declares that he has received many requests to name a committee which can handle all this legislation and harmonize it so that the people will have one distinct law to vote on, and that with be as nearly as possible an expression of the will of every county in the state.
